## I. FINAL ACTION STATUS:

HB 4581 passed the House on April 23, 1998; in the Senate was substituted for SB 2412 and passed on May 1, 1998. Became law without Governor's signature on May 30, 1998. Chapter Law 98-347.

### II. <u>SUMMARY</u>:

This legislation re-creates the Grants and Donations Trust Fund without modification. The Grants and Donations Trust Fund is administered by the Department of Corrections.

#### A. PRESENT SITUATION:

#### 1. MAJOR STATUTES THAT CONTROL THE TRUST FUND:

Section 216.212, F.S. provides for receipt of Federal grants

Section 946.512, F.S. provides for receipt of court-ordered payments from inmates performing labor with nonprofit corporation

Section 945.31, F.S. provides for receipt of administrative processing fee collected from persons in department's custody or under its supervision

Section 945.215, F.S. provides for the receipt of Inmate Welfare net proceeds

#### 2. BRIEF DESCRIPTION OF THE FUND'S USES OR PURPOSES:

The Grants and Donations Trust Fund was created in order to receive the majority of the special revenue that comes into the Department of Corrections. The Legislature appropriated \$116,660,818 to the Grants and Donations Trust Fund for the 1998-1999 fiscal year.

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		3. MAJOR SOURCES OF REVENUE FOR THE FUND:
		The sources of receipts for the 1998-1999 fiscal year are from a combination of federal grants, cost of supervision payments, day care program fees, PRIDE donations, surcharge on court ordered payment fees, inmate welfare trust funds, and interest.
