I. <u>SUMMARY</u>:

This legislation re-creates the State Attorney's Forfeiture and Investigative Trust Fund without modification. The State Attorney's Forfeiture and Investigative Trust Fund is administered by the Justice Administration Commission.

The Legislature hereby re-creates the Forfeiture and Investigative Trust Fund which will appropriate \$487,946. These funds will be divided proportionally to all State Attorney's Offices under the Justice Administration Commission.

3. MAJOR SOURCES OF REVENUE FOR THE FUND:

Revenues received by a State Attorney as a result of forfeiture proceedings, shall be deposited in the Forfeiture and Investigative Trust Fund for the investigation of crime, prosecution of criminals, or other law enforcement purposes.

B. EFFECT OF PROPOSED CHANGES:

This bill re-creates the trust fund without modification.
