The toll-free telephone number 28 shall be available 24 hours a day, 7 days per week, 365 days a 29 year. 1 Department of Law Enforcement, the state attorneys, and local 2 law enforcement agencies. 3 (2) The toll-free telephone number shall also be available for use by a crime victim, relative of a homicide 4 5 victim, or witness of a crime to inform the Crime Victims' 6 Services Office of any change of address. The Crime Victims' 7 Services Office shall provide the updated address information to the Department of Corrections, the Parole Commission, the 8 9 Department of Law Enforcement, the appropriate state attorney, 10 and the appropriate local law enforcement agencies. At least once every 6 months, the Crime Victims' Services Office shall 11 verify the address and telephone number of each victim, 12 relative, or witness who wishes to be kept informed of the 13 14 status of the person convicted of the crime. 15 Section 2.
