I. SUMMARY:

This legislation re-creates the Grants and Donations Trust Fund without modification. The Grants and Donations Trust Fund is administered by the Department of Juvenile Justice.

II. SUBSTANTIVE RESEARCH:

To capture all revenues and expenditures for federal Department of Justice grants, county grants, and miscellaneous grant funds and fees received in the Department of Juvenile Justice.

3. MAJOR SOURCES OF REVENUE FOR THE FUND:

Sources of revenue include: the National School Lunch Program, the Dade Juvenile Justice Center, the Intensive Learning Alternatives Program, Juvenile Justice and Delinquency Prevention, Children's Services Council, Block Grant Matching Fund, Community Outreach, and Community Partnership Grants.
