I. SUMMARY:

This legislation re-creates the Juvenile Justice Training Trust Fund without modification. The Juvenile Justice Training Trust Fund is administered by the Department of Juvenile Justice.

II. SUBSTANTIVE RESEARCH:

A. PRESENT SITUATION:

1. MAJOR STATUTES THAT CONTROL THE TRUST FUND:

Section 39.024, F.S., creates the trust fund and provides for its purpose.

2. BRIEF DESCRIPTION OF THE FUND'S USES OR PURPOSES:

To enable the department to fund the development and updating of a job task analysis of Juvenile Justice personnel.

3. MAJOR SOURCES OF REVENUE FOR THE FUND:

From non-criminal traffic infractions, a \$1.00 fee and Title IV-A reimbursement from the United States Department of Health and Human Services through the Federal Department of Health and Rehabilitative Services for training for Title IV-A eligibility determination and assessment and client direct services.

B. EFFECT OF PROPOSED CHANGES:

This bill re-creates the trust fund without modification.
