I. FINAL ACTION STATUS:

HB 4619 passed the House on April 23, 1998; in the Senate was substituted for SB 2452 and passed on May 1, 1998. Became law without Governor's signature on May 30, 1998. Chapter Law 98-366.

II. SUMMARY:

This legislation re-creates the Revolving Trust Fund without modification. The Revolving Trust Fund is administered by the Department of Law Enforcement.

III. SUBSTANTIVE RESEARCH:

A. PRESENT SITUATION:

1. MAJOR STATUTES THAT CONTROL THE TRUST FUND:

216.271, F.S., Authorizes creation of revolving trust funds
943.03, F.S., Authorizes the department grants of moneys for specified purposes.

2. BRIEF DESCRIPTION OF THE FUND'S USES OR PURPOSES:

The Revolving Trust Fund is used to provide "buy money" in criminal investigations. No expenditures are made. Funds are reimbursed to the state treasury. In the 1998-1999 fiscal year, the Legislature appropriated \$1,000,000.

3. MAJOR SOURCES OF REVENUE FOR THE FUND:

The only source of revenue for the fund is money transferred from the State Treasury.

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B. EFFECT OF PROPOSED CHANGES:

This bill re-creates the trust fund without modification.

C. STATUTE(S) AFFECTED:

IV. FISCAL RESEARCH & ECONOMIC IMPACT STATEMENT:

This legislation has no fiscal impact on state agencies or state funds, on local governments as a whole or on the private sector. It simply re-creates, without modification, an existing state trust fund and continues the current use of the fund.
