I. FINAL ACTION STATUS:

HB 4621 passed the House on April 23, 1998; in the Senate was substituted for SB 2434 and passed on May 1, 1998. Became law without Governor's signature on May 30, 1998. Chapter Law 98-367.

This legislation re-creates the Administrative Trust Fund without modification. The Administrative Trust Fund is administered by the Department of Legal Affairs.

The primary source of revenue is assessment of an indirect cost rate on federal grants, state contracts, and departmental trust funds.
