I. <u>SUMMARY</u>:

This legislation re-creates the Florida Crime Prevention Training Institute Trust Fund without modification. The Florida Crime Prevention Training Institute Trust Fund is administered by the Department of Legal Affairs.

A. PRESENT SITUATION:

1. MAJOR STATUTES THAT CONTROL THE TRUST FUND:

Section 16.54, F.S., creates the Florida Crime Prevention Training Institute and the trust fund, and provides for purposes.

2. BRIEF DESCRIPTION OF THE FUND'S USES OR PURPOSES:

The receipts of the Florida Crime Prevention Training Institute Revolving Trust Fund are expended for the costs incurred in establishing and conducting crime prevention training courses. The 1998-1999 fiscal year appropriation is \$463,926.

MAJOR SOURCES OF REVENUE FOR THE FUND:

The primary source of revenue is registration fees for the training courses. The department is also authorized to receive grants and donations for this purpose.

B. EFFECT OF PROPOSED CHANGES:

This bill re-creates the trust fund without modification.
