I. SUMMARY:

This legislation re-creates the Legal Affairs Revolving Trust Fund without modification. The Legal Affairs Revolving Trust Fund is administered by the Department of Legal Affairs.

II. SUBSTANTIVE RESEARCH:

A. PRESENT SITUATION:

1. MAJOR STATUTES THAT CONTROL THE TRUST FUND:

Section 16.53, F.S., provides for creation and purposes of trust fund.

2. BRIEF DESCRIPTION OF THE FUND'S USES OR PURPOSES:

The receipts of the Legal Affairs Revolving Trust Fund are expended for the investigation, prosecution, and enforcement of the Racketeering Influenced and Corrupted Organizations Act, the Florida Deceptive and Unfair Trade Practices Act, and state or federal antitrust laws. The 1998-1999 fiscal year appropriation is \$5,029,381.

3. MAJOR SOURCES OF REVENUE FOR THE FUND:

The primary source of revenue is fines, fees, forfeitures, or other judgments against defendants being prosecuted for these types of cases.

B. EFFECT OF PROPOSED CHANGES:

This bill re-creates the trust fund without modification.
