I. <u>SUMMARY</u>:

This legislation re-creates the Legal Affairs Revolving Escrow Trust Fund without modification. The Legal Affairs Revolving Escrow Trust Fund is administered by the Department of Legal Affairs.

A. PRESENT SITUATION:

Section 944.512, F.S., provides for the purposes of the trust fund.

BRIEF DESCRIPTION OF THE FUND'S USES OR PURPOSES:

The receipts of the Revolving Escrow Trust Fund are derived from judgments brought in proceedings related to state or federal antitrust law or the Florida RICO Act and are held in the account pending a final court decision or final distribution order. The funds are then distributed as ordered or as provided in statute. Funds are not appropriated from this trust fund.

3. MAJOR SOURCES OF REVENUE FOR THE FUND:

The primary sources of revenue for the Revolving Escrow Trust Fund are fines, fees, forfeitures, or other judgments against defendants being prosecuted for these types of cases.
