I. FINAL ACTION STATUS:

HB 4653 passed the House on April 23, 1998; in the Senate was substituted for SB 2456 and passed on May 1, 1998. Became law without Governor's signature on May 30, 1998. Chapter Law 98-383.

This legislation re-creates the Grants and Donations Trust Fund without modification. The Grants and Donations Trust Fund is administered by the Parole Commission.
