Paragraph (c) of subsection (4) of section 13 232.246, Florida Statutes, is amended to read: 14 232.246 General requirements for high school 15 graduation.--16 (1) Graduation requires successful completion of either a minimum of 24 academic credits in grades 9 through 12 17 or an International Baccalaureate curriculum. The 24 credits 18 19 shall be distributed as follows: 20 (a) Four credits in English, with major concentration 21 in composition and literature. 22 (b) Three credits in mathematics. Effective for students entering the 9th grade in the 1997-1998 school year 23 and thereafter, one of these credits must be Algebra I, a 24 25 series of courses equivalent to Algebra I, or a higher-level 26 mathematics course. 27 (c) Three credits in science, two of which must have a 28 laboratory component. The State Board of Education may grant 29 an annual waiver of the laboratory requirement to a school district that certifies that its laboratory facilities are 30 31 inadequate, provided the district submits a capital outlay 1 CODING: Words stricken are deletions; words underlined are additions. plan to provide adequate facilities and makes the funding of
 this plan a priority of the school board.

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(d) One credit in American history.

4 (e) One credit in world history, including a
5 comparative study of the history, doctrines, and objectives of
6 all major political systems.

7 (f) One-half credit in economics, including a 8 comparative study of the history, doctrines, and objectives of 9 all major economic systems. The Florida Council on Economic 10 Education shall provide technical assistance to the department 11 and local school boards in developing curriculum materials for 12 the study of economics.

(g) One-half credit in American government, including study of the Constitution of the United States. For students entering the 9th grade in the 1997-1998 school year and thereafter, the study of Florida government, including study of the State Constitution, the three branches of state government, and municipal and county government, shall be included as part of the required study of American government.

(h)1. One credit in practical arts career education or exploratory career education. Any vocational course as defined in s. 228.041(22) may be taken to satisfy the high school graduation requirement for one credit in practical arts or exploratory career education provided in this subparagraph;

25 2. One credit in performing fine arts to be selected 26 from music, dance, drama, painting, or sculpture. A course in 27 any art form, in addition to painting or sculpture, that 28 requires manual dexterity, or a course in speech and debate, 29 may be taken to satisfy the high school graduation requirement 30 for one credit in performing arts pursuant to this 31 subparagraph; or

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1 3. One-half credit each in practical arts career 2 education or exploratory career education and performing fine 3 arts, as defined in this paragraph. 4 5 Such credit for practical arts career education or exploratory career education or for performing fine arts shall be made 6 7 available in the 9th grade, and students shall be scheduled 8 into a 9th grade course as a priority. 9 (i) One-half credit in life management skills to include consumer education, positive emotional development, 10 11 nutrition, prevention of human immunodeficiency virus infection and acquired immune deficiency syndrome and other 12 13 sexually transmissible diseases, benefits of sexual abstinence and consequences of teenage pregnancy, information and 14 instruction on breast cancer detection and breast 15 16 self-examination, cardiopulmonary resuscitation, drug education, and the hazards of smoking. Such credit shall be 17 given for a course to be taken by all students in either the 18 9th or 10th grade. 19 20 One-half credit in physical education to include (j) assessment, improvement, and maintenance of personal fitness. 21 22 Participation in an interscholastic sport, whether at the freshman, junior varsity, or varsity level, for a full season, 23 shall satisfy the one-half credit requirement in physical 24 25 education. 26 (k) Nine elective credits. 27 28 School boards may award a maximum of one-half credit in social 29 studies and one-half elective credit for student completion of nonpaid voluntary community or school service work. Students 30 31 choosing this option must complete a minimum of 75 hours of 3

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service in order to earn the one-half credit in either 1 2 category of instruction. Credit may not be earned for service provided as a result of court action. School boards that 3 approve the award of credit for student volunteer service 4 5 shall develop guidelines regarding the award of the credit, 6 and school principals are responsible for approving specific 7 volunteer activities. A course designated in the Course Code 8 Directory as grade 9 through grade 12 which is taken below the 9th grade may be used to satisfy high school graduation 9 requirements or Florida Academic Scholar's Certificate Program 10 11 requirements as specified in a district's pupil progression 12 plan.

14 (c)<u>1.</u> District school boards are authorized and 15 encouraged to establish requirements for high school 16 graduation in excess of the minimum requirements; however, an 17 increase in academic credit or minimum grade point average 18 requirements shall not apply to those students enrolled in 19 grades 9 through 12 at the time the district school board 20 increases the requirements.

2. For the purpose of reducing school overcrowding, 21 resolving a financial crisis, or adopting a change in academic 22 focus, a district school board may apply to the State Board of 23 24 Education for a reduction or waiver of the elective credit 25 requirements for high school graduation specified in paragraph 26 (1)(k). State board approval shall be based on school district 27 need and soundness of the school district plan for 28 modification of requirements for high school graduation. 29 Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1 of the year in which enacted. 30 31
