This bill is a reviser's bill drafted by the Division of Statutory Revision of the Joint Legislative Management Committee under the authority of s. 11.242, Florida Statutes. The Division of Statutory Revision was directed by the Legislature, in s. 122, ch. 97-238, Laws of Florida, to incorporate the reorganization of the content of chapter 39, Florida Statutes, into three separate chapters of statute as provided in ch. 97-238, and in accordance with the legislative intent expressed in s. 122, ch. 97-238.
