School districts; school boards.--12 13 (a) Each county shall constitute a school district; provided, two or more contiguous counties, upon vote of the 14 15 electors of each county pursuant to law, may be combined into one school district; and provided further that a county with 16 17 45,000 or more students in the district schools within the 18 county may be divided into more than one school district, each school district to have no less than 15,000 students, as 19 20 provided by general or special law, and subject to approval by a vote of the electors of the county. In order to divide a 21 county under this provision, and notwithstanding other 22 23 provisions of this constitution, a commission may be created by special law to draw school district boundary lines, 24 allocate assets, and make provisions for the contractual 25 26 obligations, debts, and bonded indebtedness of the school 27 district, all of which shall be subject to review and approval 28 by the circuit court for compliance with state and federal law. divided pursuant to this section shall be calculated on a countywide basis and allocated as provided by general law.

(b) In each school district there shall be a school board composed of five or more members chosen by vote of the electors for appropriately staggered terms of four years, as provided by law.

(b) The school board shall operate, control and supervise all free public schools within the school district and determine the rate of school district taxes within the limits prescribed herein. Two or more school districts may operate and finance joint educational programs.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that in accordance with the requirements of section 101.161, Florida Statutes, the title and substance of the amendment proposed herein shall appear on the ballot as follows:

AUTHORIZING THE DIVISION OF A COUNTY INTO TWO OR MORE SCHOOL DISTRICTS

Provides that counties with 45,000 or more students may be divided into two or more school districts pursuant to general or special law, and subject to local voter approval. Provides a commission to draw district boundary lines, allocate assets, obligations, debts, and bonded indebtedness. Provides that, except for millage voted for bonded indebtedness, school district funding shall be calculated countywide and allocated as provided by general law.
