- (2) Each school district may award the Florida gold seal vocational endorsement to a high school student who meets the requirements of this section. To be eligible for award of the Florida gold seal vocational endorsement, a student must:
- (b) Complete three vocational credits in a sequential program of studies in a vocational job-preparatory or technology-education program. On-the-job training credit may not be substituted for the three vocational credits. Beginning in the 1997-1998 school year, a student must complete the secondary school portion of a sequential program of studies

which requires at least three secondary school vocational credits, taken over at least 2 school years, and is continued in a planned, related postsecondary education program. If the student's school does not offer such a two-plus-two program, the student is eligible for a vocational endorsement if the student completes a job-preparatory vocational education program selected by the Occupational Forecasting Conference or the Jobs and Education Partnership of Enterprise Florida for its ability to provide high-wage employment in an occupation with high potential for employment opportunities.

(d) Earn a minimum cumulative unweighted grade point average of 3.0 on a 4.0 scale on all subjects, other than Level I courses, required for a standard high school diploma.

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> If a student does not meet the requirements of this subsection as a result of inaccurate or incomplete information provided by a high school guidance counselor, teacher, or school district personnel, the student may, nevertheless, be eligible for the Florida gold seal vocational endorsement if the principal of the school or the district superintendent verifies that such inaccuracies or misinformation caused the deficiencies. The school district must provide a means for the student to correct deficiencies resulting from such misinformation. The student must correct the deficiencies no later than December 31 immediately following high school graduation, either by completing comparable work at the postsecondary institution or by completing a directed individualized study program that is developed and administered by the school district. If the student does not complete the requirements necessary to correct the deficiencies by December 31 immediately following high school

graduation, the student is ineligible to participate in the Florida Gold Seal Vocational Endorsement Program.

- (1) There is created a Florida Undergraduate Scholars' Program, to be administered by the Department of Education. The department shall award scholarships to each Florida student who:
- (a)1. Is recognized by the merit or achievement programs of the National Merit Scholarship Corporation as a scholar or finalist;
- 2. By the end of the first semester of the senior year, has obtained a 3.5 unweighted grade point average on a 4.0 scale, or the equivalent, in high school subjects, other than Level I courses, acceptable for credit toward a diploma and has attained at least the minimum score as determined by rules of the Department of Education on the combined verbal and quantitative parts of the Scholastic Aptitude Test, the Scholastic Assessment Test, or the recentered Scholastic Assessment Test of the College Entrance Examination or an equivalent score on the American College Testing Program;
- 3. Has <u>completed</u> attended a home education program during grade levels 9 through 12 according to the provisions of s. 232.02(4) and has attained at least the minimum score as determined by rules of the Department of Education on the combined verbal and quantitative parts of the Scholastic Aptitude Test, the Scholastic Assessment Test, or the recentered Scholastic Assessment Test of the College Entrance

Examination or an equivalent score on the American College Testing Program;

- 4. Has been designated by the State Board of Education as a Florida Academic Scholar, pursuant to the provisions of s. 232.2465; or
- 5. Has been awarded an International Baccalaureate Diploma from the International Baccalaureate Office.
- (b) Meets the general requirements for student eligibility as provided in s. 240.404, except as otherwise provided in this section.
- (c) Receives a standard Florida high school diploma, or its equivalent as described in s. 229.814. Any student who is enrolled on a full-time basis in the early admission program of an eligible postsecondary institution or has completed attended a home education program during grade levels 9 through 12 according to the provisions of s. 232.02(4) shall be exempt from this requirement. Also exempted shall be the dependents of Florida residents who are on military or public service assignments away from Florida when such dependents live with such Florida residents and receive high school diplomas from non-Florida schools.
- (d) Files an application for an award during his or her last year in high school within established time limits.
- (e) Attends, on a full-time basis, a <u>Florida</u> state university, or community college, or technical institute or any eligible Florida independent college, university, or <u>vocational-technical school</u>. An independent college, university, or <u>vocational-technical school</u> is eligible to <u>participate</u> if it meets the following criteria:

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- Prior to graduation, a student may be notified of eligibility of award pending award of a high school diploma.

- 2. Has a program completion and placement rate at the minimum rate established under the current Florida Statutes or the Florida Administrative Code which governs the institution, or as established by the department.
 - 3. Shows evidence of sound financial condition.
- 4.a. Is accredited at the institutional level by an accrediting agency recognized by the United States Department of Education and has operated in the state for 3 years under the same ownership during which time there have been no complaints for which probable cause has been found; or
- b. Is licensed by the state and has operated in the state for 5 years under the same ownership during which time there have been no complaints for which probable cause has been found. authorized by Florida law; a nursing diploma school approved by the Board of Nursing; or any Florida college, university, or community college which is accredited by a member of the Commission on Recognition of Postsecondary Accreditation the credits of which are acceptable for transfer without qualification to state universities.
- (f) Enrolls as a first-time-in-college student. Any student who earns postsecondary academic credit prior to or during the summer immediately subsequent to receiving a high school diploma, who is dually enrolled in secondary and postsecondary educational institutions, or who is enrolled in the early admission program of a postsecondary institution shall be exempt from this requirement.
- (g) At the time an application is submitted, has not been convicted of a felony.

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Students who apply for awards no later than April 1 during their last year in high school may later reapply to receive awards during subsequent application periods when they do not accept their initial awards. Similarly, students who receive initial awards and who later do not accept renewal awards may reapply to receive awards during subsequent application periods. Students who apply under this paragraph must submit reinstatement applications within 3 years of filing their initial applications. The department shall accept reinstatement applications postmarked between February 15 and June 1 of each year and shall determine the eligibility of such applicants in the same manner as first-time applicants, except that students who apply pursuant to this paragraph shall be exempt from the provisions of paragraph (1)(f) and shall be required to have maintained the equivalent of a 3.0 3.2 cumulative grade point average on a 4.0 scale for all college work attempted. The department shall not make awards to reinstatement applicants who submit applications that are postmarked after June 1.

(3)(a) The annual and subsequent renewal award to a student shall be an amount sufficient to pay for tuition and mandatory fees and \$500 for books and college-related expenses 24 \$2,500; however, the highest-ranked, eligible, initial applicant from each county shall be designated as a Challenger Astronauts Memorial Award recipient and shall receive an annual and subsequent renewal award of \$4,000. The department shall rank eligible initial applicants for purposes of designating the Challenger Astronauts Memorial Award recipients on the basis of unweighted grade point averages on a 4.0 scale and test scores achieved on the combined verbal

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29 30 and quantitative parts of the Scholastic Aptitude Test of the College Entrance Examination. Renewal awards shall be \$4,000 annually for eliqible Challenger Astronauts Memorial Award recipients and \$2,500 annually for all other eligible applicants. Payment of an award shall be transmitted, on behalf of the student, to the president of the college, university, community college, or nursing diploma school which the recipient is attending or to his or her representative in advance of the registration period. If funds are insufficient to provide the full amount of scholarship authorized in this section to each eligible applicant, the department may prorate available funds and make a partial award to each eligible applicant.

(4) A recipient shall maintain the equivalent of a 3.0 15 $\langle 0 \rangle$ cumulative grade point average on a 4.0 scale, or shall maintain an approved equivalent student progress evaluation plan, on at least 12 hours per quarter, trimester, or semester in order to be eligible for a continuation of the award. A recipient who fails to meet the grade point requirement may be eligible for the Florida Postsecondary Tuition Program if continuation or reinstatement requirements for that program are met. No student may receive a Florida Undergraduate Scholars' Program award for more than the equivalent of 8 semesters or 12 quarters. However, a student enrolled in a 5-year undergraduate degree program may receive an award for the equivalent of 10 semesters or 15 quarters. The award may be renewed annually upon documentation by the recipient that he or she meets the necessary qualifications. If any recipient transfers from one accredited Florida college, university, community college, or nursing diploma school to another eligible institution, his or her award will be

transferable, provided he or she is otherwise eligible for the award.

Educational Enhancement Trust Fund general revenue and from the Challenger Astronauts Memorial Undergraduate Scholarship Trust Fund, funds to be deposited into the State Student Financial Assistance Trust Fund for the purpose of funding this act. - 2. A nonpublic postsecondary school or college under the jurisdiction of the State Board of Independent Postsecondary Vocational, Technical, Trade, and Business Schools or the State Board of Independent Colleges and Universities. To be eligible, a licensed school or college must have been in continuous operation for at least 5 years and must have held a biennial or regular license for at least

2 years, must not have been the subject of a finding of probable cause and subsequent disciplinary action by either board, must not be required by the Federal Government to apply for reimbursement for Title IV funding, and must be located in and chartered by the state. A licensed school or college or a school or college exempt from licensure must be accredited by the Career College Association, the Accrediting Bureau of Health Education Schools, or the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools and must never have had its accreditation removed; and

- (5) To be eligible for the renewal of an award, an applicant each academic year must:
- (a) Maintain a minimum cumulative grade point average of $2.5 \ \frac{3.0}{3.0}$ on a $4.0 \ \text{scale}$, or the equivalent; and

A student who fails to attain a 2.5 cumulative grade point average at any time while attending a postsecondary institution may have eligibility restored upon attaining a cumulative grade point average of 2.5 or above during the eligibility period. No student shall be eligible for more than one reinstatement of eligibility.

(b) Students who apply for awards no later than April 1 during their last year in high school and who meet all other eligibility requirements to receive awards may later reapply to receive awards during subsequent application periods when they do not accept their initial awards. Similarly, students who receive initial awards and who later do not accept renewal

awards may reapply to receive awards during subsequent application periods. Students who apply under this paragraph must submit reinstatement applications within 3 years after filing their initial applications. Section 6. Section 240.4024, Florida Statutes, 1996 Supplement, is amended to read:

240.4024 Florida Postsecondary Tuition Program. --

- (1) The Florida Postsecondary Tuition Program is hereby created to reward outstanding high school students with financial assistance in <u>undergraduate</u> degree, diploma, or certificate programs at any Florida public university, community college, or technical institute or at any eligible Florida independent college, university, or vocational—technical school. An independent college, university, or vocational—technical school is eligible to participate if it meets the following criteria:
- (a) Is located in and chartered as a domestic corporation by the state.
- (b) Has a program completion and placement rate at the minimum rate established under the current Florida Statutes or the Florida Administrative Code which governs the institution, or as established by the department.
 - (c) Shows evidence of sound financial condition.
- (d)1. Is accredited at the institutional level by an accrediting agency recognized by the United States Department of Education and has operated in the state for 3 years under the same ownership during which time there have been no complaints for which probable cause has been found; or
- 2. Is licensed by the state and has operated in the state for 5 years under the same ownership during which time there have been no complaints for which probable cause has been found.

This financial assistance shall be in the form of scholarships and may be used to assist with <u>any educational costs</u> the cost of education, not to exceed the cost of tuition, mandatory fees, and books. Except as otherwise provided in this section, the scholarship shall cover the full cost of tuition subject

to the availability of funds and may not exceed the cost of tuition. The scholarship may not be used for remedial courses.

- (2) In order to be eligible to receive a scholarship under the Florida Postsecondary Tuition Program, an initial-year applicant must:
 - (a) Be a Florida resident.
- (b) Receive a <u>standard</u> Florida high school diploma, or its equivalent as described in s. 229.814, in or after 1997

 1996. Any student who is enrolled on a full-time basis in the early admission program of an eligible postsecondary institution or has <u>completed</u> attended a home education program during grade levels 9 through 12 according to the provisions of s. 232.02(4) shall be exempt from this requirement. Also exempt shall be the dependents of Florida residents who are on military or public service assignments away from Florida when such dependents live with such Florida residents and receive high school diplomas from non-Florida schools.
- (c) At the time an application is submitted, have not been convicted of a felony.
- year of high school time of application or by the end of the senior year, have been enrolled in, and intend to complete, a college preparatory curriculum, have an unweighted grade point average of 3.0 or above on a 4.0 scale in courses, other than Level I courses, as identified by the Department of Education, and by the time of graduation have attained at least the minimum score established by the Department of Education on the American College Test or the Scholastic Assessment Test; or
- 2. At the time of application or by the end of the senior year, have been enrolled in a curriculum other than a

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college preparatory curriculum, have an unweighted grade point average of 3.0 or above on a 4.0 scale, and have attained at least the minimum score established by the department on the American College Test or the Scholastic Assessment Test;

- 2.3. At the time of application, be a home education program student, or a high school equivalency diploma recipient, who has attained at least the minimum score established by the department on the American College Test or the Scholastic Assessment Test.
- (e) Utilize the an initial scholarship within 7 years of the date of high school graduation by the date established by the department.

Prior to graduation, a student may be notified of eligibility of award pending award of a high school diploma.

(3) Students may receive annual awards for the first year of either full-time or part-time enrollment 30 semester credit hours attempted at any eligible Florida postsecondary educational institution as defined in subsection (1). As used in this section, the term "eligible Florida postsecondary institution" means an institution within the State University System, the community college system, or a public vocational-technical institution. The maximum amount of the award shall include tuition, mandatory fees, and a book allowance of up to \$300, except that students who receive a grade point average of 3.5 on a 4.0 scale, or above, in a college preparatory curriculum may receive a higher award as determined by the department. The maximum award for tuition for students in the independent institutions shall not exceed the average tuition per credit hour calculated by the department for the state universities. Awards shall be

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disbursed in equal installments each academic term. Full-time enrollment shall not be required. Awards through this program may be made to degree-seeking students enrolled for a minimum of 6 credit hours who meet the general requirements for student eligibility as provided in this section. Students enrolled for 6 to 8 credit hours may receive up to one-half of the maximum award; students enrolled for 9 to 11 credit hours may receive up to three-fourths of the maximum award; and students enrolled for 12 or more credit hours may receive up to the full award.

- (a) A scholarship shall be awarded prior to the certification or award of a federal family education loan or federal direct loan and shall be considered in the certification or calculation of the student's loan eligibility.
- (b) Students attending a Florida public technical institute or independent vocational-technical school in order to earn a certificate or diploma may qualify for tuition scholarships for the cost of tuition, not to exceed the average tuition per credit hour calculated by the department for the state universities. Students pursuing certificates or diplomas at Florida public or private technical institutes or schools must enroll in programs of study which are at least 900 clock hours in length mandatory fees, and up to \$150 per semester for a book allowance. Awards through this program may be made to students enrolled for a minimum of 6 credit hours, or the equivalent in clock hours, in a job preparatory vocational program who meet the general requirements for student eligibility as provided in this section. Students enrolled for 6 to 8 credit hours, or the equivalent in clock hours, may receive up to one-half of the maximum award;

students enrolled for 9 to 11 credit hours, or the equivalent in clock hours, may receive up to three-fourths of the maximum award; and students enrolled for 12 or more credit hours, or the equivalent in clock hours, may receive up to the full award.

- (4) Students may renew a scholarship for their sophomore, junior, and senior years of undergraduate study. To do so, the student must:
- (a) Maintain at least a 2.5 3.0 cumulative grade point average on a 4.0 scale in courses attempted.
- (b) Be making satisfactory academic progress if classified as a certificate-seeking or diploma-seeking student.
- (c) Have used, within a maximum period of 7 5 years from the date of high school graduation, less than the maximum number of semesters of eligibility as determined by the department. The department may waive this paragraph for students who demonstrate that compliance would entail extraordinary hardship.

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Renewal eligibility shall be determined at the end of the second semester or third quarter of each subsequent regular academic year of postsecondary participation. A student who fails to attain a 2.5 cumulative grade point average at any time while attending a postsecondary institution may have eligibility restored upon attaining a cumulative grade point average of 2.5 or above during the eligibility period. No student shall be eligible for more than one reinstatement of eligibility.

(5) A student planning to attend an eligible 31 postsecondary institution must comply with any application

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requirements established by the <u>department</u> institution. Upon verifying that the student meets eligibility criteria established in this section, the eligible institution shall submit to the department a request for the appropriate level of payment; however, the department may transmit a portion of the funds to the institution prior to registration. The department shall establish the necessary data to be reported and a date by which such requests for payment are due each semester. Late requests shall be honored by the department to the extent that funds are available after all timely requests have been funded.

- (6) The department shall adopt rules as necessary to implement and administer the Florida Postsecondary Tuition Program.
- (7) Each institution that receives moneys through this program shall cause to be prepared an annual report that includes an independent external audit or an audit prepared by the Office of the Auditor General. The report must include an audit of the institution's administration of the program and a complete accounting of the moneys for the program. This report must be submitted to the Department of Education annually on or before March 1. The department may conduct its own annual audit of an institution's administration of the program and may request a refund of any moneys overpaid to the institution for the program. The department may suspend or revoke an institution's eligibility to receive future moneys for the program if the department finds that an institution has not complied with this section. An institution must remit within 60 days any refund requested in accordance with this subsection.

(8)(7) The program shall be implemented to the extent authorized annually in the General Appropriations Act. If funds are insufficient to provide the full amount of scholarships authorized in this section to each eligible applicant, the department may prorate available funds and make a partial award to each eligible applicant.

Section 7. Paragraph (a) of subsection (1) of section 240.404, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:

240.404 General requirements for student eligibility for state financial aid.--

- (1)(a) The general requirements for eligibility of students for state financial aid awards consist of the following:
- 1. Acceptance at a state university or community college; a nursing diploma school approved by the Florida Board of Nursing; a Florida college, university, or community college which is accredited by a member of the Commission on Recognition of Postsecondary Accreditation; any Florida institution the credits of which are acceptable for transfer to state universities; any area technical center; or any private vocational-technical institution accredited by a member of the Commission on Recognition of Postsecondary Accreditation.
- 2. Participation in the college-level communication and computation skills testing program. This requirement is limited to students seeking associate's or bachelor's degrees.
- 3. Residency in this state for no less than 1 year preceding the award of aid for a program established pursuant to s. 240.402, s. 240.4021, <u>s. 240.4024</u>, s. 240.4085, s. 240.409, s. 240.4093, s. 240.4095, s. 240.4097, s. 240.412, s. 240.4125, s. 240.413, s. 240.4987, s. 240.605, or s. 240.606.

Residency in this state must be for purposes other than to obtain an education. Resident status for purposes of receiving state financial aid awards shall be determined in the same manner as resident status for tuition purposes pursuant to s. 240.1201 and rules of the State Board of Education.

- 4. Compliance with Selective Service System registration requirements pursuant to s. 240.4045.
- 5. Submission of certification attesting to the accuracy, completeness, and correctness of information provided to demonstrate a student's eligibility to receive state financial aid awards. Falsification of such information shall result in the denial of any pending application and revocation of any award currently held to the extent that no further payments shall be made. Additionally, students who knowingly make false statements in order to receive state financial aid awards shall be guilty of a misdemeanor of the second degree subject to the provisions of s. 837.06 and shall be required to return all state financial aid awards wrongfully obtained.

Section 8. This act shall take effect July 1, 1997.

HOUSE SUMMARY
