**I. SUMMARY:**

This bill annexes 2.293 acres into the territorial limits of the Northern Palm Beach County Improvement District (District).

According to the attached Economic Impact Statement (EIS), this bill will have no impact on the revenues or expenditures of the District. The EIS states the bill will facilitate administration of the District.

II. SUBSTANTIVE ANALYSIS:

A. PRESENT SITUATION:

The Northern Palm Beach County Improvement District (District), formerly the Northern Palm Beach County Water Control District, is an independent district created by special act chapter 59-994, Laws of Florida, as a chapter 298, F.S., drainage or water control district. The District is responsible for drainage and land reclamation within a 250,000-acre area in northern Palm Beach County. The predominant land use is residential and industrial and includes eight municipalities and the United Technologies, Pratt and Whitney Aircraft Engine Facility.

The District is divided into units of development. When a simple majority of property owners petition the Board of Supervisors for reclamation or improvements, the discrete geographical land unit where such benefit is derived is established as a unit of development. Assessments are levied in each unit of development in proportion to improvements made.

Chapter 95-489, Laws of Florida, changed the name of the Northern Palm County Water Control District to the Northern Palm Beach County Improvement District (District) and significantly expanded the scope of the District's authorized activities beyond water control and drainage. The act authorized the district to provide, construct, operate, and maintain community or public preserves, playgrounds, amphitheaters, and recreation and sports areas and facilities as part of the District's plan of improvements for a unit of development. The act excluded the operation or maintenance of a professional sports stadium from this grant of additional power. The development, operation, and maintenance of improvements authorized by the act must be financed as a part of the unit development's plan of improvements through debt and/or maintenance taxes, user fees, and other legally available revenues. The annual cost of operating and maintaining such improvements must be included in the unit of development's maintenance taxes.

B. EFFECT OF PROPOSED CHANGES:

This bill annexes 2.293 acres into the territorial limits of the Northern Palm Beach County Improvement District.
