I. SUMMARY:

This bill renames the Greater Boca Raton Beach Tax District as the Greater Boca Raton Beach and Park District (District). The bill provides for District commissioners to receive \$50 per diem in compensation for attendance at a meeting of the District board, or a meeting attended by any commissioner at which the purposes, obligations, or business of the District are discussed or transacted. Members may not receive compensation for more than one meeting per day. The bill also increases from \$1,000 to \$5,000 the minimum purchase or lease amount that must be competitively bid.

According to the attached Economic Impact Statement, the bill would have no fiscal impact on the District.

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II. SUBSTANTIVE ANALYSIS:

A. PRESENT SITUATION:

The Greater Boca Raton Tax District was created by chapter 74-423, Laws of Florida. The District, which was renamed the Greater Boca Raton Beach Tax District (District) (chapter 76-323, Laws of Florida), is an independent tax District governed by an elected five member board of commissioners. The purposes of the District are to reimburse the City of Boca Raton costs associated with acquiring and improving beach properties and park properties, and to acquire, maintain, operate, or improve beach or park properties. The District is authorized to levy an ad valorem tax not to exceed 2 mills.

Subsection (7) of section 2 of chapter 74-423, Laws of Florida, created by chapter 82-350, Laws of Florida, provides for District commissioners to receive compensation based upon per diem compensation allowable by statute. Section 7 of chapter 74-423, Laws of Florida, as amended by chapter 76-323, Laws of Florida, requires the District board to competitively bid all purchases or leases of supplies, equipment, materials, or office space in excess of \$1,000.

B. EFFECT OF PROPOSED CHANGES:

This bill renames the Greater Boca Raton Beach Tax District as the Greater Boca Raton Beach and Park District. The bill provides for District commissioners to receive \$50 per diem in compensation for attendance at a meeting of the District board, or a meeting attended by any commissioner at which the purposes, obligations, or business of the District are discussed or transacted. E. SECTION-BY-SECTION ANALYSIS:

Section 1. Section 1 of chapter 74-423, Laws of Florida, as amended, is amended to change the name of the Greater Boca Raton Beach Tax District to the Greater Boca Raton Beach and Park District.

Section 2. Subsection (7) of section 2 of chapter 74-423, Laws of Florida, as created by chapter 82-350, Laws of Florida, is amended to provide for District commissioners to receive in compensation an amount equal to the dollar amount set forth in section 112.061(6)(a)1., F.S., (\$50/day) for attendance at a meeting of the district board, or a meeting attended by any commissioner at which the purposes, obligations, or business of the District are discussed or transacted. Members may not receive compensation for more than one meeting per day.

Section 3. Section 7 of chapter 74-323, Laws of Florida, as amended by chapter 76-323, Laws of Florida, is amended to increase from \$1,000 to \$5,000 the minimum purchase or lease amount that must be competitively bid.

Section 4. This section provides a severability clause.
