Section 1. Paragraph (a) of subsection (1) and subsection (4) of section 232.2465, Florida Statutes, are amended to read:

232.2465 Florida Academic Scholars' Certificate Program.—For the purpose of recognizing and rewarding outstanding performance and academic achievement on the part of public school students and nonpublic school students, the Commissioner of Education shall award to each high school graduate who meets the requirements specified herein, and as further specified by the State Board of Education, a special certificate recognizing and designating the graduate as a Florida Academic Scholar.

- (1) In order to qualify as a Florida Academic Scholar, a student must:
- (a) Earn a minimum unweighted grade point average of 3.5 on a 4.0 scale for all coursework, which must include completion of Complete a program of at least 24 credits in advanced-level studies as prescribed by the State Board of Education, including as a minimum:
- 1. Four years of progressively advanced instruction in language arts, including courses in English composition and literature;

- 2. Four years of progressively advanced instruction in science, including laboratory courses in biology, chemistry, and physics where laboratory facilities are available;
- 3. Four years of progressively advanced instruction in mathematics, including courses in algebra and geometry and calculus or trigonometry;
  - 4. Two years of sequential foreign language;
- 5. One year of instruction in art and music or in either art or music;
- 6. Three years of instruction in social studies, including courses in American history and government, world history, and comparative political and economic systems; and
- 7. One year of instruction in health and physical education to include assessment, improvement, and maintenance of personal fitness.
- advanced proficiency, as defined by the State Board of Education, through performance on the combined verbal and quantitative portions of an approved standardized test and who enrolls full time in a state university, a public community college, a nursing diploma school approved by the Board of Nursing, or a private institution of higher education which is accredited by a member of the Commission on Recognition of Postsecondary Accreditation or the credits of which are acceptable for transfer to state universities is eligible for a scholarship under Tier I provisions of s. 240.4024 from the Florida Undergraduate Scholars' Program, as provided by s. 240.402.

Section 3. Section 240.402, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:

240.402 Florida Undergraduate Scholars award designation Scholars' Program.--

(1) There is created a Florida Undergraduate Scholars award designation Scholars' Program, to be administered by the Department of Education. The department shall designate Florida Undergraduate Scholars and award such designees scholarships under Tier II provisions of s. 240.4024. An award designee is any to each Florida student who does not

## qualify as a Florida Academic Scholar, pursuant to s. 232.2465, but who:

- (a)1. Is recognized by the merit or achievement programs of the National Merit Scholarship Corporation as a scholar or finalist;
- 2. - (b) Meets the general requirements for student eligibility as provided in s. 240.404, except as otherwise provided in this section.
- (c) Receives a Florida high school diploma, or its equivalent as described in s. 229.814. Any student who is enrolled on a full-time basis in the early admission program of an eligible postsecondary institution or has attended a home education program during grade levels 9 through 12 according to the provisions of s. 232.02(4) shall be exempt from this requirement. Also exempted shall be the dependents of Florida residents who are on military or public service assignments away from Florida when such dependents live with such Florida residents and receive high school diplomas from non-Florida schools.
- (d) Files an application for an award <u>designation</u> during his or her last year in high school within established time limits.
- (e) Attends, on a full-time basis, a state university or community college authorized by Florida law; a nursing diploma school approved by the Board of Nursing; or any Florida college, university, or community college which is accredited by a member of the Commission on Recognition of Postsecondary Accreditation the credits of which are

acceptable for transfer without qualification to state universities.

- (f) Enrolls as a first-time-in-college student. Any student who earns postsecondary academic credit prior to or during the summer immediately subsequent to receiving a high school diploma, who is dually enrolled in secondary and postsecondary educational institutions, or who is enrolled in the early admission program of a postsecondary institution shall be exempt from this requirement.
- (2)(a) The department shall accept applications for initial <u>award designations</u> <u>awards</u> postmarked between February 15 and April 1 of each year. The department may <u>designate as a Florida Undergraduate Scholar any qualified applicant who submits an initial application that is <u>make awards to initial applicants who submit applications that are postmarked after April 1, pursuant to rules of the State Board of Education.</u></u>
- (b) Students who apply for <u>award designation awards</u> no later than April 1 during their last year in high school may later reapply to receive <u>Tier II scholarship</u> awards during subsequent application periods when they do not accept their initial awards. Students who apply under this paragraph must submit reinstatement applications within 3 years of filing their initial applications. (3)(a) The annual award to a student shall be \$2,500; however, the highest-ranked, eligible, initial applicant from each county shall be designated as a Challenger Astronauts Memorial Award recipient and shall receive an annual award of \$4,000. The department shall rank eligible initial applicants for purposes of designating the Challenger Astronauts Memorial Award recipients on the basis of unweighted grade point averages on a 4.0 scale and test scores achieved on the combined verbal and quantitative parts of the Scholastic Aptitude Test of the College Entrance Examination. Renewal awards shall be \$4,000 annually for eligible Challenger Astronauts Memorial Award recipients and \$2,500 annually for all other eligible applicants. Payment of an award shall be transmitted, on behalf of the student, to the president of the college, university, community college, or nursing diploma school which the recipient is attending or to his or her representative in advance of the registration period. If funds are insufficient to provide the full amount of scholarship authorized in this section to each eligible applicant, the department may prorate available funds and make a partial award to each eligible applicant.

(b) Within 15 days of the end of regular registration, inclusive of a drop-add period, institutions shall certify to the department the eligibility status of each awarded student. The eligibility status of each student to receive a disbursement shall be determined by each institution as of this date. Institutions shall not be required to reevaluate a student's eligibility status after this date for purposes of amending eligibility determinations previously made. However, an institution shall be requested to make refunds for students who receive award disbursements and terminate enrollment for any reason during the academic term when an institution's refund policies permit a student to receive a refund under these circumstances.

(c) Institutions shall certify to the department the amount of funds disbursed to each student and shall remit to

- 1. A public state university, community college, or area vocational-technical school authorized by law <u>at which</u> the postsecondary portion of a sequential program of studies in a vocational job-preparatory or technology-education curriculum is offered; or
- 2. A nonpublic postsecondary school or college under the jurisdiction of the State Board of Independent Postsecondary Vocational, Technical, Trade, and Business Schools or the State Board of Independent Colleges and Universities, at which the postsecondary portion of a sequential program of studies in a vocational job-preparatory or technology-education program is offered. To be eligible, a licensed school or college must have been in continuous operation for at least 5 years and must have held a biennial or regular license for at least 2 years, must not have been the subject of a finding of probable cause and subsequent disciplinary action by either board, must not be required by the Federal Government to apply for reimbursement for Title IV funding, and must be located in and chartered by the state. A licensed school or college or a school or college exempt from licensure must be accredited by the Career College Association, the Accrediting Bureau of Health Education Schools, or the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools and must never have had its accreditation removed; and
- (d) Is enrolled in the postsecondary portion of a sequential program of studies in a vocational job-preparatory or technology-education program a course or program of at least 900 clock hours, 36 quarter hours, or 24 semester hours which awards a diploma as defined in s. 246.203.

- 1. A student enrolled in a nonpublic school must be enrolled in a program which is comparable and compatible, as determined by the State Board of Independent Postsecondary Vocational, Technical, Trade, and Business Schools, with a public job-preparatory vocational-technical program and the program standards, including curriculum framework and student performance standards, as provided by rule of the State Board of Education.
- 2. A student enrolled in a nonpublic school must meet the same basic skills requirements as a student enrolled in public certificate career education as provided by rule of the State Board of Education.

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- The department shall issue the maximum annual (d) award to each eligible applicant if funds are available. If funds are insufficient to provide a full scholarship to each eligible applicant, the department may prorate available funds and make a partial award to each eligible applicant.
- (7)(a) Notwithstanding s. 240.404(3), a vocational gold seal scholarship may be received for a maximum of 2 years, 4 semesters, or an equivalent number of credit hours. The annual maximum award to an initial each recipient shall be equal to 75 percent of the tuition and mandatory fees at an eligible postsecondary institution, plus a book stipend of \$112.50 per semester or an annual  $\frac{1}{2}$  maximum of  $\frac{$225}{2,000}$ . The maximum award in a renewal year or from the third semester onward shall be equal to 100 percent of the tuition and mandatory fees at an eligible postsecondary institution, plus a book stipend of \$150 per semester or an annual maximum of 30 \$300. Payment of an award shall be transmitted in advance of the registration period each semester on behalf of the student

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to the president of the university or community college, or his or her representative, or to the director of the area vocational-technical school which the recipient is attending, or his or her representative, except that the department may withhold payment if the receiving institution fails to report or to make refunds to the department as required in paragraphs (b) and (c).

(d) Any recipient of a vocational gold seal endorsement award who received his or her initial award to be used no later than the 1996-1997 academic year remains eligible to receive a vocational gold seal endorsement award for up to 4 years, 8 semesters, or an equivalent number of credit hours, subject to the renewal eligibility criteria of subsection (5). Semesters or quarters in which the vocational gold seal endorsement award has already been received shall be credited against the number of semesters or quarters of eligibility remaining for an award. Award recipients subject to this paragraph are required, notwithstanding paragraph (3)(d), to be enrolled in a course or program of at least 900 clock hours, 36 quarter hours, or 24 semester hours which awards a diploma as defined in s. 246.203. 240.4024 Florida Postsecondary Tuition Program. --

(1) (a) The Florida Postsecondary Tuition Program is hereby created to reward outstanding high school students with financial assistance in degree, diploma, or certificate

programs at any Florida public university, community college, or technical institute. This financial assistance shall be in the form of scholarships and may be used to assist with the cost of education, not to exceed the cost of tuition, mandatory fees, and books. Except as otherwise provided in this section, the scholarship shall cover the full cost of tuition subject to the availability of funds. The scholarship may not be used for remedial courses.

- (b) Remedial courses may not be taken during any academic term in which a scholarship is received. If a scholarship recipient enrolls in remedial courses during an academic term in which he or she utilizes a scholarship, the scholarship for that term is forfeited and the recipient must pay the postsecondary institution he or she attends the amount forfeited. Institutions must remit all forfeited funds to the state for deposit into the Educational Enhancement Trust Fund.
- (2) In order to be eligible to receive a scholarship under the Florida Postsecondary Tuition Program, an initial-year applicant must:
  - (a) Be a Florida resident.
- (b) Receive a Florida high school diploma, or its equivalent as described in s. 229.814, in or after 1997 1996. Any student who is enrolled on a full-time basis in the early admission program of an eligible postsecondary institution or has attended a home education program during grade levels 9 through 12 according to the provisions of s. 232.02(4) shall be exempt from this requirement. Also exempt shall be the dependents of Florida residents who are on military or public service assignments away from Florida when such dependents live with such Florida residents and receive high school diplomas from non-Florida schools.

- (c) Have not been convicted of a felony.
- (d)1. At the time of application or by the end of the senior year, have been enrolled in, and intend to complete, a college preparatory curriculum, have an unweighted grade point average of 3.0 or above on a 4.0 scale in any curriculum, and have attained at least the minimum score established by the Department of Education on the American College Test or the Scholastic Assessment Test; or
- 2. At the time of application or by the end of the senior year, have been enrolled in a curriculum other than a college preparatory curriculum, have an unweighted grade point average of 3.0 or above on a 4.0 scale, and have attained at least the minimum score established by the department on the American College Test or the Scholastic Assessment Test;
- $\underline{2.3.}$  At the time of application, be a home education program student, or a high school equivalency diploma recipient, who has attained at least the minimum score established by the department on the American College Test or the Scholastic Assessment Test.
- (e) Utilize an initial scholarship by the date established by the department.
- (3) (a) Florida Postsecondary Tuition Program awards
  shall be offered in three tiers conditioned upon the
  cumulative academic achievement of eligible students in grades
  9 through 12. The tiers are delineated as follows:
- 1. Tier I; Florida Academic Scholars.--An eligible student qualifying as a Florida Academic Scholar, pursuant to s. 232.2465, is designated in Tier I. The maximum award for this tier is equal to 100 percent of the annual tuition and mandatory fees at any eligible Florida postsecondary institution, plus a book stipend of \$150 per semester or an

annual maximum of \$300. However, a Florida Academic Scholar who enrolls at a nonpublic postsecondary institution under provisions of s. 232.2465(4) shall receive an annual award equal to the maximum annual Tier I award offered for enrollment at a state university.

- 2. Tier II; Florida Undergraduate Scholars.--Any eligible student not qualifying under Tier I but qualifying as an award designee pursuant to s. 240.402 is designated as a Florida Undergraduate Scholar in Tier II. The maximum award for this tier is equal to 75 percent of the annual tuition and mandatory fees at any eligible Florida postsecondary institution, plus a book stipend of \$112.50 per semester or an annual maximum of \$225. However, a Florida Undergraduate Scholar who enrolls at a nonpublic postsecondary institution under provisions of s. 240.402(1)(e) shall receive an annual award equal to the maximum annual Tier II award offered for enrollment at a state university.
- 3. Tier III; Florida Student Achievement Awards.--An eligible student not qualifying under Tier I or Tier II is designated as a recipient of a Florida Student Achievement Award in Tier III. The maximum annual award for this tier is 50 percent of the annual tuition and mandatory fees at any eligible Florida postsecondary institution, plus a book stipend of \$75 per semester or an annual maximum of \$150.
- (b)1. Students may receive annual awards for the first 30 semester credit hours attempted at any eligible Florida postsecondary educational institution. As used in this section, except for provisions in paragraph (a) for students qualifying in Tier I or Tier II, the term "eligible Florida postsecondary institution" means an institution within the State University System, the community college system, or a

public vocational-technical institution. The maximum amount of the award shall include tuition, mandatory fees, and a book allowance of up to \$300, except that students who receive a grade point average of 3.5 on a 4.0 scale, or above, in a college preparatory curriculum may receive a higher award as determined by the department. Awards shall be disbursed in equal installments each academic term, except that a partial award shall be disbursed if an eligible student does not take a full-time courseload, in which case the award shall be prorated based upon the proportion of hours taken to hours required for a full award.

- 2. For Tier III scholarships only, full-time enrollment shall not be required. Tier III awards through this program may be made to degree-seeking students enrolled for a minimum of 6 credit hours who meet the general requirements for student eligibility as provided in this section. Students enrolled for 6 to 8 credit hours may receive up to one-half of the maximum Tier III award; students enrolled for 9 to 11 credit hours may receive up to three-fourths of the maximum Tier III award; and students enrolled for 12 or more credit hours may receive up to the full Tier III award.
- 3.(a) A scholarship shall be awarded prior to the certification or award of a federal family education loan or federal direct loan and shall be considered in the certification or calculation of the student's loan eligibility.
- (b) Students attending a Florida public technical institute in order to earn a certificate or diploma may qualify for tuition scholarships for the cost of tuition, mandatory fees, and up to \$150 per semester for a book

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allowance. Awards through this program may be made to students enrolled for a minimum of 6 credit hours in a job preparatory vocational program who meet the general requirements for student eligibility as provided in this section. Students enrolled for 6 to 8 credit hours may receive up to one-half of the maximum award; students enrolled for 9 to 11 credit hours may receive up to three-fourths of the maximum award; and students enrolled for 12 or more credit hours may receive up to the full award.

(4)(a)1. Notwithstanding s. 240.404(1), a recipient of a Tier I or Tier II award shall maintain the equivalent of a 3.2 cumulative grade point average on a 4.0 scale, or shall maintain an approved equivalent student progress evaluation plan, on at least 12 hours per quarter, trimester, or semester in order to be eligible for a continuation of the award. No student may receive a Tier I or Tier II award for more than the equivalent of 8 semesters or 12 quarters. However, a student enrolled in a 5-year undergraduate degree program may receive an award for the equivalent of 10 semesters or 15 quarters. The award may be renewed annually upon documentation by the recipient that he or she meets the necessary qualifications. If any recipient transfers from one accredited Florida college, university, community college, or nursing diploma school to another eligible institution, his or her award shall be transferable, provided he or she is otherwise eligible for the award. - $\underline{\text{1.(a)}}$  Notwithstanding s. 240.404(1), maintain at least a 3.0 cumulative grade point average on a 4.0 scale.
  - 2.(b) Be making satisfactory academic progress.
- 3.(c) Have used, within a maximum period of 5 years from the date of high school graduation, less than the maximum number of semesters of eligibility as determined by the department. The department may waive this paragraph for students who demonstrate that compliance would entail extraordinary hardship.
- (5) A student planning to attend an eligible postsecondary institution must comply with any application requirements established by the institution. Upon verifying that the student meets eligibility criteria established in

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this section, the eligible institution shall submit to the department a request for the appropriate level of payment. The department shall establish the necessary data to be reported and a date by which such requests for payment are due each semester. Late requests shall be honored by the department to the extent that funds are available after all timely requests have been funded.

(6) The highest-ranked, eligible, initial applicant from each county shall be designated as a Challenger Astronauts Memorial award recipient and shall receive an annual award equal to the maximum annual award available in the recipient's qualifying tier plus an additional \$1,500. The department shall rank eligible initial applicants for purposes of designating the Challenger Astronauts Memorial award recipients on the basis of unweighted grade point averages on a 4.0 scale and test scores achieved on the combined verbal and quantitative parts of the Scholastic Aptitude Test of the College Entrance Examination. Renewal awards for eligible Challenger Astronauts Memorial award recipients shall be equal to the maximum annual award available in the recipient's qualifying tier in the renewal year plus an additional \$1,500. Payment of an award shall be transmitted, on behalf of the student, to the president of the college, university, community college, or nursing diploma school which the recipient is attending or to his or her representative in advance of the registration period.

 $\underline{(7)}$  (6) The department shall adopt rules as necessary to implement and administer the Florida Postsecondary Tuition Program.

 $\underline{(8)}\overline{(7)}$  The program shall be implemented to the extent authorized annually in the General Appropriations Act. The

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department shall issue the maximum annual award to each eligible applicant in each tier if funds are available. If funds are insufficient to provide the full amount of scholarships authorized in this section to each eligible applicant, the department may prorate available funds and make a partial award to each eligible applicant.

- (9) Any recipient of a Florida Undergraduate Scholars award who received his or her initial award to be used no later than the 1996-1997 academic year is eligible to receive a Tier I award subject to the renewal eligibility criteria of subsection (4). Semesters or quarters in which the Florida Undergraduate Scholars award has already been received are credited against the number of semesters or quarters of eligibility remaining for a Florida Postsecondary Tuition Program award.
- (10) The Legislature shall appropriate funds for awards authorized in this section from general revenue, the Educational Enhancement Trust Fund, and the Challenger Astronauts Memorial Undergraduate Scholarship Trust Fund.

Section 6. Paragraph (a) of subsection (1) of section 240.4025, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:

240.4025 Florida Graduate Scholars' Fund.--

- (1) There is created a Florida Graduate Scholars' Fund to be administered by the Department of Education. The department shall award fellowships to each Florida graduate student who:
- (a)1. Has received a scholarship pursuant to s. 240.402 or s. 240.4024 for the duration of his or her undergraduate enrollment; or
- 2. Has obtained a 3.5 grade point average on a 4.0 31 | scale, or the equivalent, in college-level academic subjects

taken during his or her last 2 academic years and has scored 1,200 or above on the combined verbal and quantitative parts of the Graduate Record Examination.

Section 7. Paragraph (a) of subsection (1) of section 240.404, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:

240.404 General requirements for student eligibility for state financial aid.--

- (1)(a) The general requirements for eligibility of students for state financial aid awards consist of the following:
- 1. Acceptance at a state university or community college; a nursing diploma school approved by the Florida Board of Nursing; a Florida college, university, or community college which is accredited by a member of the Commission on Recognition of Postsecondary Accreditation; any Florida institution the credits of which are acceptable for transfer to state universities; any area technical center; or any private vocational-technical institution accredited by a member of the Commission on Recognition of Postsecondary Accreditation.
- 2. Participation in the college-level communication and computation skills testing program. This requirement is limited to students seeking associate's or bachelor's degrees.
- 3. Residency in this state for no less than 1 year preceding the award of aid for a program established pursuant to s. 240.402, s. 240.4021, s. 240.4024, s. 240.4085, s. 240.409, s. 240.4093, s. 240.4095, s. 240.4097, s. 240.412, s. 240.4125, s. 240.413, s. 240.4987, s. 240.605, or s. 240.606. Residency in this state must be for purposes other than to obtain an education. Resident status for purposes of receiving state financial aid awards shall be determined in the same

manner as resident status for tuition purposes pursuant to s. 240.1201 and rules of the State Board of Education.

- 4. Compliance with Selective Service System registration requirements pursuant to s. 240.4045.
- 5. Submission of certification attesting to the accuracy, completeness, and correctness of information provided to demonstrate a student's eligibility to receive state financial aid awards. Falsification of such information shall result in the denial of any pending application and revocation of any award currently held to the extent that no further payments shall be made. Additionally, students who knowingly make false statements in order to receive state financial aid awards shall be guilty of a misdemeanor of the second degree subject to the provisions of s. 837.06 and shall be required to return all state financial aid awards wrongfully obtained.

Section 8. Subsection (1) of section 240.408, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:

240.408 Challenger Astronauts Memorial Undergraduate Scholarship Trust Fund.--

(1) There is created the Challenger Astronauts Memorial Undergraduate Scholarship Trust Fund which shall receive distributions as provided by s. 320.08058. The Comptroller shall authorize expenditures from this fund for Challenger Astronauts Memorial awards pursuant to s. 240.4024 240.402, and any remaining balances may be expended for graduate fellowships in space science, space commerce, or space policy research pursuant to s. 240.4025, and for education/business partnership programs which involve teacher development strategies pursuant to s. 229.602, upon receipt of vouchers approved by the Department of Education. The

Comptroller shall also authorize expenditures from this fund for Challenger Astronauts Memorial Undergraduate Scholarships for students who participated in this program prior to July 1, 1993, provided that such students continue to meet the renewal eligibility requirements that were in effect at the time that their original awards were made. Any balance therein at the end of any fiscal year shall remain therein and shall be available for carrying out the purposes of these programs.

Section 9. Subsection (7) of section 240.4085, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:

240.4085 Florida Student Tuition Scholarship Grant Program.--

(7) No student receiving an award pursuant to s. 240.402 or s. 240.4024 shall be eligible to receive a Florida Student Tuition Scholarship Grant. No student receiving a Florida Student Tuition Scholarship Grant shall receive a student assistance grant pursuant to s. 240.409, s. 240.4095, or s. 240.4097 unless he or she is eligible for such award after the Florida Student Tuition Scholarship Grant has been considered by the department when conducting an assessment of the financial resources available to the student. A student receiving a Florida Student Tuition Scholarship Grant shall not be eligible to receive payment or credit from any other state-funded program established specifically to provide for payment of tuition and fees, except a student assistance grant as provided in s. 240.409, s. 240.4095, or s. 240.4097 and a Florida resident access grant as provided in s. 240.605.

Section 10. Paragraph (f) of subsection (2) of section 240.437, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:

240.437 Student financial aid planning and development.--

- (2) The objective of a state program is the maintenance of a state student financial aid program to supplement a basic national program which will provide equal access to postsecondary education to citizens of this state who have the ability and motivation to benefit from a postsecondary education. In the development of a state program to achieve this objective, it shall be the policy that:
- (f) Effective August 1, 1985, students enrolled in associate in arts degree programs and bachelor's degree programs in independent institutions in this state who receive state aid pursuant to s. 240.402, s. 240.4024, s. 240.4063, s. 240.4085, s. 240.4095, s. 240.4097, s. 240.412, s. 240.605, or s. 240.606 participate in the college-level communication and computation skills testing program provided in s. 229.551. The department and the eligible institutions shall negotiate an agreement that will assure that the test is available to students either directly through the independent institutions or on a contractual basis with a state community college or university. Before August 1, 1985, all independent institutions subject to this provision shall have an opportunity to participate in preliminary testing activities similar to those afforded the public institutions before the initiation of formal testing; and the independent sector shall be afforded appropriate representation on all committees and commissions charged with responsibilities for developing, administering, and evaluating the tests.

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Planning and development shall be in accordance with the foregoing objective and policies.

Section 11. This act shall take effect July 1, 1997.
