23	objects of different sizes, shapes, and textures, and
24	WHEREAS, there is no other time in a child's life as
25	productive for brain development as the first year, NOW

28	Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

30	Section 1. Each state-funded education and care
31	program for children from birth to 5 years of age must provide

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activities to foster brain development in infants and 1 2 toddlers. A program must provide an environment rich in 3 language and music and filled with objects of various colors, 4 shapes, textures, and sizes to stimulate visual, tactile, 5 auditory, and linguistic senses in the children and must 6 include classical music and at least 30 minutes of reading to 7 the children each day. A program may be offered through an 8 existing early childhood program such as Healthy Start, the 9 Title I program, contracted or directly operated subsidized 10 child care, the prekindergarten early-intervention program, Florida First Start, the Head Start program, or a private 11 12 childcare program. A program must provide training for the infants' and toddlers' parents including direct dialogue and 13 14 interaction between teachers and parents demonstrating the 15 urgency of brain development in the first year of a child's life. Family daycare centers are encouraged, but not required, 16 17 to comply with this section. 18 Section 2. The Executive Office of the Governor shall 19 contract for an evaluation of programs to stimulate brain 20 development in infants and toddlers and shall report the results of the evaluation to the President of the Senate and 21 22 the Speaker of the House of Representatives by January 1, 23 2000. 24 Section 3.
