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HOUSE SUMMARY Provides for development and implementation of a statewide program for automated fingerprint imaging of public assistance applicants and recipients. Limits use of such imaging to the prevention of public assistance fraud. Directs the Departments of Children and Family Services and Labor and Employment Security to prepare a plan by April 1998 for implementation of the program. Requires pilot implementation by November 1, 1998. Provides for evaluation of pilot results to determine the method of statewide expansion of the program. Provides for use of savings from fraud reduction in expanding the program. Authorizes the departments to request federal waivers necessary for program implementation. waivers necessary for program implementation. 

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
