I of the State Constitution, and shall not 28 be disclosed to any person other than the patient without the 29 written consent of that patient or the patient's guardian. 30 This section is subject to the Open Government Sunset Review Act of 1995 in accordance with s. 119.15, and shall stand

repealed on October 2, 2002, unless reviewed and saved from repeal by reenactment of the Legislature.

Section 2. Subsection (8) is added to section 400.843, Florida Statutes, to read:

400.843 Background screening of home medical equipment supplier personnel--The agency shall require employment screening as provided in chapter 435, using the level 1 standards for screening set forth in that chapter, for home medical equipment supplier personnel.

(8) The criminal records, juvenile records, or central abuse hotline information obtained by the agency or a home medical equipment supplier for determining the moral character of personnel of a home medical equipment supplier are confidential and exempt from the provisions of s. 119.07(1) and s. 24(a), Art. I of the State Constitution. This section is subject to the Open Government Sunset Review Act of 1995 in accordance with s. 119.15, and shall stand repealed on October 2, 2002, unless reviewed and saved from repeal by reenactment of the Legislature.

Section 3. The Legislature finds that the exemptions provided for in sections 1 and 2 of this act are a public necessity.

Section 4. This act shall take effect on the same date as House Bill or similar legislation takes effect, if such legislation is adopted in the same legislative session or an extension thereof.

********** HOUSE SUMMARY Provides a public records exemption for patient information received by employees of a home medical equipment supplier or by the Agency for Health Care Administration through the reports or inspections of such suppliers.
