However, if after taking all deductive alternates, 26 27 the bid of the lowest responsible bidder exceeds the 28 construction budget for the project established at the phase III submittal, the board may declare an emergency. After 29 30 stating the reasons why an emergency exists, the board may negotiate the construction contract or modify the contract,

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including the specifications, with the lowest responsible bidder and, if the contract is modified, shall resubmit the documents to the department for review. The board may reject all bids received and may readvertise, calling for new bids.
