A bill to be entitled An act relating to the offense of fleeing or attempting to elude a law enforcement officer; amending s. 316.1935, F.S.; providing that it is a third-degree felony for the operator of a vehicle to fail to stop the vehicle when so directed by a law enforcement officer or to attempt to elude such officer; providing that, following an order by a law enforcement officer to stop, it is a second-degree felony for a person to cause the law enforcement officer to engage in a vehicle pursuit, regardless of the speed of the pursuit; providing that the offense of aggravated fleeing or eluding a law enforcement officer is a second-degree felony; amending s. 921.0022, F.S., relating to the offense severity ranking chart of the Criminal Punishment Code; revising the ranking of such offenses to conform to changes made by the act; providing an effective date.
