(2) No candidate, in the furtherance of his or her 21 22 candidacy for nomination or election to public office in any 23 election, shall use any state-owned aircraft or motor vehicle, as provided in chapter 287, solely for the purpose of 24 25 furthering his or her candidacy. However, in the event a candidate uses any state-owned aircraft or motor vehicle to 26 27 conduct official state business and while on such trip 28 performs any function in the furtherance of his or her candidacy for nomination or election to public office in any 29 30 election, the candidate shall prorate the expenses incurred 31 and reimburse the appropriate agency for any trip not 1

1 exclusively for state business and shall pay either a prorated 2 share of all fixed and variable expenses related to the 3 ownership, operation, and use of such aircraft or one-half of 4 the total fixed and variable expenses related to the 5 ownership, operation, and use of such aircraft, whichever is б greater. The reimbursement shall be made from the campaign 7 account of the candidate. 8 (3) A person may not use any state-owned aircraft to 9 further any candidacy for public office. 10 (4) (4) (3) No candidate shall, in the furtherance of his 11 or her candidacy for nomination or election to public office in any election, use the services of any officer or employee 12 13 of the state during working hours. (5) (4) No person shall make and no person shall 14 15 solicit or knowingly accept any political contribution in a building owned by a governmental entity. For purposes of this 16 17 subsection, "accept" means to receive a contribution by personal hand delivery from a contributor or the contributor's 18 19 agent. This subsection shall not apply when a 20 government-owned building or any portion thereof is rented for the specific purpose of holding a campaign fund raiser. 21 22 (6) (5) Any person who violates subsection (3) is guilty of a felony of the third degree, punishable as provided 23 24 in s. 775.082 or s. 775.083.
