Section 1. Section 768.125, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:

768.125 Liability for injury or damage resulting from intoxication; cap on damages; punitive damages.--

(1) Any A person licensed under chapter 561 who negligently sells, gives, or furnishes, or otherwise provides alcoholic beverages to a person who is visibly intoxicated of lawful drinking age shall be not thereby become liable for injury or damage caused by or resulting from the intoxication of such person. Any, except that a person who willfully and unlawfully sells, gives, or furnishes, or otherwise provides alcoholic beverages to a person who, through reasonable procedures, should have been known to be is not of lawful

drinking age or who <u>negligently</u> knowingly serves a person habitually addicted to the <u>excessive</u> use of any or all alcoholic beverages may become liable for injury or damage caused by or resulting from the intoxication of such minor or person.

- (2) In any civil action based on negligence pursuant to the provisions of this section, the amount of noneconomic damages recoverable shall not exceed \$250,000; provided that the defendant admits liability within 90 days after service of the complaint in any civil action filed pursuant to this section.
- (3) In any civil action based on negligence pursuant to the provisions of this section where punitive damages are awarded, the punitive damages shall be deposited into the Operating Trust Fund of the Department of Law Enforcement for the purpose of providing financial assistance to the survivors of law enforcement officers who were killed in the line of duty by persons under the influence of alcoholic beverages.

 The clerk of the court shall transmit a copy of the jury verdict to the State Treasurer by certified mail. The Department of Banking and Finance shall collect or cause to be collected all payments due under this section. Such payments shall be made to the Comptroller and deposited into the Operating Trust Fund of the Department of Law Enforcement.
