468.609 Administration of this part; standards for certification; additional categories of certification.--

- (2) A person shall be entitled to take the examination for certification pursuant to this part if the person:
- (c) Meets eligibility requirements according to one of the following criteria:
- 1. Demonstrates 5 years' combined experience in the field of construction or inspection corresponding to the certification category sought;
- 2. Demonstrates a combination of postsecondary education in the field of construction or a related field and experience which totals 4 years, with at least 1 year of such experience in construction or building inspection; or
- 3. For certification as a building code administrator or building official, demonstrates 10 years' combined experience as an architect, engineer, building inspector, contractor, or construction superintendent, with at least 5 years of such experience in supervisory positions; or
- 4. Currently holds a standard certificate issued by the board and satisfactorily completes an inspector or plans examiner training program of not less than 200 hours, as established by the board and administered by such agencies and institutions as approved by the board corresponding to the certification category sought.

(d) A newly employed person who is qualified for a provisional or temporary certificate may perform the duties of a plans examiner or inspector if a provisional or temporary certificate application has been submitted to the board for approval and such person is under the direct supervision of a
