A resolution recognizing Dorothy M. Schirtzinger, Director, Lee County Library System, as Library Journal's 1996 Librarian of the Year.

WHEREAS, Library Journal, a publication read in more than 25,000 libraries across the country, named Dorothy M. Schirtzinger the 1996 Librarian of the Year, the highest honor awarded a librarian for outstanding achievement and exceptional dedication, and

WHEREAS, her experience with libraries began when she helped her sixth-grade English teacher convert a janitor's closet into a library and continued at age fourteen with volunteer activities at a library in Worthington, Ohio, and

WHEREAS, Dorothy M. Schirtzinger earned a B.A. degree in English at Ohio State University in 1953, completed the Library Executive Development Program at Miami University in Oxford, Ohio, in 1973, and earned an M.A. degree in Library, Media and Information Studies at the University of South Florida in 1981, and

WHEREAS, after becoming acting director of the Lee County Library System in 1980 and permanent director in 1981, Dorothy Schirtzinger began a program of library replacement, renovation, and expansion, and transformed the library system from eight inadequate buildings, 100,000 out-of-date books, and 23 employees into a system with 11 libraries, 800,000 books, and 191 employees, and

WHEREAS, Dorothy Schirtzinger maintains a highly trained and talented staff and provides accurate, current, and

convenient service through technological advancement and placement of facilities, and

WHEREAS, Dorothy Schirtzinger was instrumental in the formation of the first library cooperative in Southwest Florida and has administered more than 40 federal grant programs, some of which have become permanent programs, and

WHEREAS, Dorothy Schirtzinger has been a member of and an officer in many local, state, and national library organizations; a speaker at workshops, conferences, and other engagements; and a promoter of Florida Library Legislative Day, Lee County Library Day, and ALA Legislative Day in Washington, D.C., and

WHEREAS, Dorothy Schirtzinger served on the Florida State Advisory Council on Libraries, the OCLC Advisory Committee on Public Libraries, representing public libraries in the southeastern United States, and the Florida Network Planning Task Force, and

WHEREAS, for her achievements, Dorothy M. Schirtzinger was inducted into Phi Kappa Phi Honor Society and was awarded the Florida Library Association 1993 Intellectual Freedom Award and the University of South Florida School of Library on Information Science 1995 Jean Key Gates Distinguished Alumna Award, and

WHEREAS, on February 14, 1997, Dorothy Schirtzinger was honored in Washington by the American Library Association and on March 3rd of this year she was honored at Lee County Library Day, NOW, THEREFORE,

Be It Resolved by the House of Representatives of the State of Florida:

That Dorothy M. Schirtzinger, Library Journal's 1996 Librarian of the Year, is hereby commended for her outstanding achievements and public service to our community, state, and nation.
