WHEREAS, John Olan Pearce, Jr., was born June 6, 1918, a sixth generation cattleman and, until his death on February 4, 1997, a lifelong champion of the cattle industry in Florida, and

WHEREAS, said by some to be one of the most important men to ever serve the cattle industry in this state, J. O. Pearce, Jr., grew up as part of the pioneer-style ranching that had sprung up with the first wave of settlers who migrated into the Kissimmee Valley, and

WHEREAS, Mr. Pearce, with his father, actively promoted good animal health practices and the two were instrumental in the formation of the Florida Cattlemen's Association, of which he served as president for three terms, and

WHEREAS, Mr. Pearce worked toward alleviating many problems in the cattle industry at local, state, and national levels and in 1984 was named Man of the Year in Service to Florida Agriculture by Progressive Farmer Magazine, and

WHEREAS, Mr. Pearce received countless other awards and recognitions for his contributions to the cattle industry and to agriculture in general, the most notable of which was induction into the Florida Agriculture Hall of Fame in 1985, and

WHEREAS, known for his warm smile of greeting to everyone, whether a member of his cattle crew, a friend, or a congressman in Washington, J. O. Pearce, Jr., will be remembered as a hard-working man who loved his family and loved the land, NOW, THEREFORE,
