House Resolution

A resolution paying tribute to the memory of Chief Judge L.B. "Buck" Vocelle.

WHEREAS, Chief Judge L.B. "Buck" Vocelle, a lifetime resident of Vero Beach, was born August 4, 1926, a member of one of Indian River County's pioneer families, and

WHEREAS, L.B. Vocelle graduated in 1949, a member of the second men's class at Florida State University, obtained a law degree from the University of Florida in 1952, and joined the practice of his father, James T. Vocelle, one of the founders of Indian River County, and

WHEREAS, L.B. Vocelle, who served his state in the House of Representatives from 1956 to 1962, continued to practice law until 1979, when he was appointed by then-Governor Bob Graham to the newly created judgeship of the Nineteenth Judicial Circuit, and

WHEREAS, widely respected for his evenhandedness, compassion, and commitment to equal justice under the law, in 1993, Judge Vocelle was elected chief judge by his peers in the circuit, a position he would continue to hold until his death on November 30, 1996, and

WHEREAS, Judge Vocelle, who cared deeply about children and the future of the nation, which he defended in the Pacific Theater as a teenage Marine in World War II, worked tirelessly in his efforts to help establish the teen court, community arbitration, and family court programs, and

WHEREAS, Judge Vocelle is survived by his wife of forty-one years, Kathleen, and four children, L.B. Vocelle, Jr., Kathleen Vocelle Kelley, Cynthia Vocelle Howard, and Charles Vocelle, and

WHEREAS, Judge Vocelle, counted among Indian River County's greatest leaders, will be remembered as a man of integrity, who "did justice and loved mercy" and was concerned less with legal technicality than in doing what was right, NOW, THEREFORE, Be It Resolved by the House of Representatives of the State of Florida: That the House of Representatives pauses in its deliberations to pay tribute to a great man, Chief Judge L.B. "Buck" Vocelle. BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a copy of this resolution be presented to Kathleen Vocelle as a tangible token of the sentiments expressed herein.
