House Resolution

A resolution expressing appreciation to Arthur William "Bink" Glisson.

WHEREAS, Wellington pioneer Arthur William "Bink" Glisson, who lived on Wellington before it acquired its name, was born August 2, 1914, at Welaka, on the St. Johns River, and, as an infant, was brought by his parents to Palm Beach County, where he has continued to reside since that time, and

WHEREAS, Bink Glisson survived the ravages of the devastating hurricanes of 1926 and 1928 and has since witnessed many changes in the Glades area, some wrought by nature, some by time, and some by Bink himself, and

WHEREAS, Bink Glisson saw action in the Pacific Theater during World War II as a member of the United States Navy, and, while stationed at Key West, met Edward R. Stettinius, Secretary of State under President Roosevelt, a meeting which was to change the direction of Bink's life, and

WHEREAS, after the war, Bink Glisson became associated with Mr. Stettinius as estate superintendent, boat captain, and trusted friend and, after the death of Stettinius, Bink helped his widow sell the estate to C.O. Wellington, and

WHEREAS, continuing to act as agent for Wellington, Bink Glisson eventually amassed an area of 18,000 acres and formed the Acme Drainage District, later to become the Acme Improvement District, which allowed drainage of the acreage, thus making the land suitable for farming and ranching, and

WHEREAS, as its first employee, Bink Glisson served as supervisor and executive director of Acme for 40 years, during which time 10,000 acres of the district were sold to Jim Nall,

 the first developer of what has become the Village of Wellington, and

WHEREAS, in considering the changes that have taken place during his lifetime, Bink Glisson conceived the idea of a museum, and today the Bink Glisson Historical Museum will afford a unique opportunity for both residents and visitors to learn from its fine collections, NOW, THEREFORE,

Be It Resolved by the House of Representatives of the State of Florida:

That the House of Representatives pauses in its deliberations to pay tribute to Arthur William "Bink" Glisson for his part in the birth of the Village of Wellington and for the establishment of the Bink Glisson Historical Museum.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a copy of this resolution be presented to Arthur William "Bink" Glisson as a tangible token of the sentiments expressed herein.
