(1) A person may not assume the identity of another person by any means, including the assumption of another person's identification number, and then act as that other person in any business or economic transaction, or in any legal matter, thereby causing an economic loss to any other person or business or causing a legal disability to any other

- (a) A misdemeanor of the first degree, punishable as provided in section 775.082 or section 775.083, Florida
