1 House Resolution A resolution welcoming the Imperial Tombs of 2 3 China exhibition to Florida. 4 WHEREAS, the people of Florida will be privileged to 5 6 have the Imperial Tombs of China art exhibition at the Orlando 7 Museum of Art from May 2 through September 15, 1997, and 8 WHEREAS, the Orlando Museum of Art, one of only five 9 United States venues to exhibit this collection, will be the final host for the exhibition before it is returned to 10 mainland China, and 11 WHEREAS, this priceless exhibition, covering 2,500 12 13 years of Chinese art and culture, consists of 250 national treasures, more than 60 percent of which until recently were 14 15 never permitted outside of China, and will provide a once-in-a-lifetime exposure to Chinese art and culture 16 17 spanning seven dynasties of Chinese emperors from 500 B.C. to 18 the twentieth century, and WHEREAS, it has been forecast that the Imperial Tombs 19 of China will attract over 400 thousand visitors, with a 20 projected \$137 million economic impact on the state, and 21 WHEREAS, this exhibition also marks the opening of the 22 \$7.7 million, 30,786 square-foot Phase II renovation and 23 24 expansion of the Orlando Museum of Art, and WHEREAS, the Imperial Tombs of China exhibition is 25 26 considered to be the most important Chinese collection ever to 27 be displayed outside of China, NOW, THEREFORE, 28 29 Be It Resolved by the House of Representatives of the State of 30 Florida:
