A bill to be entitled 1 2 An act relating to eradication of agricultural pests; prescribing additional duties of the 3 4 Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services 5 and the Department of Health with respect to 6 programs of emergency aerial application of 7 pesticide for eradication of plant pests; requiring use of certain pesticides; requiring 8 9 development of a system for informing the 10 public of such programs and requiring public and other notice of certain programs of pest 11 12 eradication; providing for information to be furnished to health-care providers; providing 13 for health advisory committees; providing an 14 effective date. 15

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Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

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- Section 1. To carry out its duties with respect to emergency responses to plant pest infestations when the eradication programs involve the aerial application of a pesticide to an urbanized area, the Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services shall:
- (1) Use a pesticide previously approved by the United States Environmental Protection Agency for that eradication purpose.
- (2) Provide a system for dissemination of information to the public about infestations of pests that are the subject of such eradication programs. The system shall disseminate information relating to the pest; the pesticide selected to eradicate that pest; the generally accepted effects, if any,

of the pesticide on the human population and the environment in the area in which an aerial eradication program will be 2 3 conducted; recommended safety precautions; and the alternative methods of responding to the pest infestation, if any. 4 5 Section 2. At any time when the Department of 6 Agriculture and Consumer Services is conducting an emergency response to a plant pest infestation which involves the aerial 7 8 application of a pesticide to an urbanized area, the Department of Health shall monitor health problems that result 9 from chemical exposure about which complaints are made to 10 11 physicians and health care facilities. The Department of Health shall provide a toll-free hotline on which persons may 12 register complaints and shall make a record of all calls 13 received on that line. In consultation with the Department of 14 Health, the Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services 15 shall adopt by rule standards for determining when the use of 16 17 a particular pesticide should be discontinued. 18 Section 3. Before the Department of Agriculture and 19 Consumer Services begins an emergency response to a plant pest infestation which involves the aerial application of a 20 pesticide to an urbanized area, the department shall notify 21 the public in the area in which the pesticide is to be applied 22 of its impending action. Notice must be given at least 96 23 24 hours before beginning the aerial application of a pesticide to an urbanized area. The department shall use all reasonable 25 methods to disseminate information required under this section 26 27 as widely as possible. Information to be disseminated includes, but is not limited to: a copy of any 28 29 Environmental-Protection-Agency permit or other permit under which the pesticide will be applied, and the source, including 30 the date of publication, of any technical information, if 31

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available, about the pesticide which is included in the notice; the projected area over which the pesticide will be applied; the predicted duration of the application period; and the number of the Department of Health's toll-free hotline. When the emergency response to a plant pest infestation requires the aerial application of a pesticide to an urbanized area for a period longer than 1 week, the department shall notify the public in the area of the program's continuation. The department shall notify the public in the area when an emergency response to a plant pest infestation which requires the aerial application of a pesticide to an urbanized area is terminated.

Section 4. The Department of Health shall provide physicians and health care facilities in an area in which the Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services is conducting an emergency response to a plant pest infestation which involves the aerial application of a pesticide to an urbanized area with technical assistance relating to health problems that result from chemical exposure. The Department of Health shall provide the names, addresses, and telephone numbers of physicians and health care facilities in the area in which the eradication program will be conducted which specialize in health problems resulting from chemical exposure.

The Department of Health shall provide technical assistance to the Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services when the latter department is carrying out an emergency response to a plant pest infestation which involves the aerial application of a pesticide to an urbanized area and shall establish a health advisory committee. committee shall consist of seven members and shall include the State Health Officer, the local health officer, the poison

information center director, a toxicologist from the Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services, a person 2 3 representing the state teaching hospital, a physician practicing in the area, and an epidemiologist from the 4 5 Department of Health. The duties of the health advisory 6 committee are to serve as a resource, under the supervision of 7 the Department of Health, to the Department of Health and the 8 Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services in carrying out their duties under this act; duties of the health advisory 9 committee include, but are not limited to, review of the 10 11 aggregate information collected from physician and hotline 12 calls. Section 6. The Commissioner of Agriculture shall 13 notify the Governor and the other members of the Cabinet that 14 the Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services will begin 15 an emergency response to a plant pest infestation which 16 17 involves the aerial application of a pesticide to an urbanized area at the same time the department provides public notice 18 19 under section 3 and shall include in that notification the same information contained in the public notice. When the 20 response is conducted over a period longer than 1 week, the 21 commissioner shall notify the Governor and the other members 22 of the Cabinet of its continuation. The commissioner shall 23 24 notify the Governor and the other members of the Cabinet when 25 an emergency response to a plant pest infestation which requires the aerial application of a pesticide to a 26 27 residential area is terminated. Section 7. As used in this act, the term "urbanized 28 29 area" means land that is zoned for purposes other than 30 agricultural purposes and that has a residential density of 31 two or more units per acre.
