Business records provided by the owner or onsite operator of a business to a governmental condemning 13 authority after the governmental condemning authority has 14 tendered a prelitigation offer under section 77.0511, Florida 15 Statutes, are exempt from the disclosure provisions of section 16 17 24(a) of Article I of the State Constitution and section 119.07(1), Florida Statutes. This exemption is subject to the 18 19 Open Government Sunset Review Act in accordance with section 119.15, Florida Statutes, and expires on October 2, 2003, 20 21 unless reviewed and reenacted by the Legislature. 22 Section 2. The Legislature finds that it is a public 23 necessity that the business records of an owner or onsite operator of a business that is tendered a prelitigation offer 24 25 in an eminent domain proceeding be held confidential in order to encourage prelitigation settlements. Furthermore, the 26 Legislature finds that it would be an invasion of privacy for 27 28 these sensitive business records to be revealed to the public. Section 3. This act shall take effect on the effective 29 30 date of SB 92 or similar legislation, relating to eminent 31
