23-940-98 See HJR 1 Senate Joint Resolution No. ____ 2 A joint resolution proposing an amendment to Section 17 of Article I of the State 3 4 Constitution relating to excessive punishment. 5 6 Be It Resolved by the Legislature of the State of Florida: 7 That the amendment to Section 17 of Article I of the 8 9 State Constitution set forth below is agreed to and shall be 10 submitted to the electors of Florida for approval or rejection at the general election to be held in November 1998: 11 12 SECTION 17. Excessive punishments. -- Excessive fines, cruel or unusual punishment, attainder, forfeiture of estate, 13 indefinite imprisonment, and unreasonable detention of 14 witnesses are forbidden. The death penalty is an authorized 15 punishment for capital crimes designated by the Legislature. 16 17 Any method of execution shall be allowed, unless prohibited by the United States Constitution. The prohibition against cruel 18 19 or unusual punishment shall be construed in conformity with 20 the 8th Amendment to the United States Constitution, as 21 interpreted by the United States Supreme Court. A sentence of 22 death shall not be reduced on the basis that a method of execution is invalid. In any case in which an execution method 23 is declared invalid, the death sentence shall remain in force 24 25 until the sentence can be lawfully executed by any valid 26 method. This section shall apply retroactively. 27 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that in accordance with the requirements of section 101.161, Florida Statutes, the title 28 29 and substance of the amendment proposed herein shall appear on 30 the ballot as follows: 31 PRESERVATION OF THE DEATH PENALTY; 1
