Subsection (12) of section 233.25, Florida 13 Statutes, is amended, present subsections (13) and (14) of 14 that section are redesignated as subsections (15) and (16), 15 respectively, and new subsections (13) and (14) are added to 16 that section to read: 17 233.25 Duties, responsibilities, and requirements of 18 19 publishers and manufacturers of instructional materials. -- Publishers and manufacturers of instructional 20 21 materials, or their representatives, shall: 22 (12) Maintain, or contract with, a depository in the state and maintain there an inventory sufficient to receive 23 and fill orders for instructional materials. 24 25 (13) Maintain in the depository for no longer than 2 years textbooks in an amount sufficient to receive and fill 26 27 orders. 28 (14) Maintain in the depository for no longer than 1 year ancillary instructional materials in an amount sufficient 29 30 to receive and fill orders. 31

8	(3) Each school district that meets the current and
9	previous terms of adoption for instructional materials may use
10	up to 75 percent of its annual allocation for the purchase of
11	any instructional materials, including technology. However,
12	the funds available under this subsection to school districts
13	for the purchase of materials not on the state adopted list
14	may not be used to purchase electronic or computer hardware,
15	even if the hardware is bundled with software or other
16	electronic media, nor may the funds be used to purchase
17	equipment or supplies.
18	Section 3. This act shall take effect July 1, 1999.
