21-89B-99 1 A bill to be entitled 2 An act relating to urban policy; creating the Institute on Urban Policy and Commerce; 3 4 providing for the purposes of the institute; 5 directing the institute to investigate specific 6 issues; directing the establishment of regional 7 centers; providing reporting requirements; providing an effective date. 8 9 10 WHEREAS, through years of serious neglect and deprivation, urban communities have become plagued by 11 12 pervasive poverty and economic and physical distress, and WHEREAS, many of these urban communities have become 13 14 ghost towns overwhelmed by unemployment, vacant buildings, and boarded-up homes, and 15 WHEREAS, the majority of these inner city communities 16 17 are underserved and are cut off from the larger community by a lack of employment skills and a lack of business and economic 18 19 development opportunities due to a profusion of social and 20 family burdens, including poverty, crime, substance abuse, illiteracy, and overcrowding, NOW, THEREFORE, 21 22 23 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida: 24 Section 1. 25 There is created the Institute on Urban 26 Policy and Commerce as a Type I Institute under the Board of 27 Regents at Florida Agricultural and Mechanical University to 28 improve the quality of life in urban communities through 29 research, teaching, and outreach activities. 30 Section 2. The major purposes of the institute are to pursue basic and applied research on urban policy issues 31 1

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1 confronting the inner-city areas and neighborhoods in the state; to influence the equitable allocation and stewardship 2 3 of federal, state, and local financial resources; to train a new generation of civic leaders and university students 4 5 interested in approaches to community planning and design; to б assist with the planning, development, and capacity building 7 of urban area nonprofit organizations and government agencies; 8 to develop and maintain a data base relating to inner city areas; and to support the community development efforts of 9 inner city areas, neighborhood-based organizations, and 10 11 municipal agencies. Section 3. The institute shall research and recommend 12 strategies concerning critical issues facing the underserved 13 population in urban communities, including, but not limited 14 to, transportation and physical infrastructure; affordable 15 housing; tourism and commerce; environmental restoration; job 16 17 development and retention; child care; public health; life-long learning; family intervention; public safety; and 18 19 community relations. Section 4. The institute shall establish regional 20 urban centers to be located in the inner cities of St. 21 Petersburg, Tampa, Jacksonville, Orlando, West Palm Beach, Ft. 22 Lauderdale, Miami, Daytona Beach, and Pensacola to assist 23 24 urban communities on critical economic, social, and educational problems affecting the underserved population. 25 Section 5. Before January 1 of each year, the 26 27 institute must submit a report of its critical findings and recommendations for the prior year to the President of the 28 29 Senate, the Speaker of the House of Representatives, and the 30 appropriate committees of the Legislature. The report shall be titled "The State of Unmet Needs in Florida's Urban 31

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Communities" and should include, but is not limited to, a recommended list of resources that could be made available for revitalizing urban communities; significant accomplishments and activities of the institute; and recommendations concerning the expansion, improvement, or termination of the б institute. Section 6. The Governor shall submit an annual report to the Legislature on the unmet needs in the state's urban communities. Section 7. This act shall take effect July 1, 1999. ************************************* SENATE SUMMARY Creates the Institute on Urban Policy and Commerce at Florida Agricultural and Mechanical University.
