Section 106.05, Florida Statutes, is amended to read: 13 106.05 Deposit of contributions; statement of campaign 14 treasurer.--All funds received by the campaign treasurer of 15 any candidate or political committee shall, prior to the end 16 17 of the 5th business day following the receipt thereof, Saturdays, Sundays, and legal holidays excluded, be deposited 18 19 in a campaign depository designated pursuant to s. 106.021, in 20 an account designated "...(name of candidate or committee)... 21 Campaign Account." Except for cashiers' checks, all checks 22 received by the campaign treasurer must be endorsed personally by the candidate before being deposited in a campaign 23 depository.Except for contributions to political committees 24 25 made by payroll deduction, all deposits shall be accompanied by a bank deposit slip containing the name of each contributor 26 27 and the amount contributed by each. If a contribution is 28 deposited in a secondary campaign depository, the depository shall forward the full amount of the deposit, along with a 29 30 copy of the deposit slip accompanying the deposit, to the 31

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primary campaign depository prior to the end of the 1st business day following the deposit. Section 2. Section 106.051, Florida Statutes, is created to read: 106.051 Solicitation of campaign contributions; limitation. -- A member of the State Legislature shall not solicit or accept any campaign contribution on behalf of any legislator, a political party, or any candidate for the Legislature 30 days prior to a regular or special legislative session, during a regular or special legislative session, or 14 days following a regular or special legislative session. Section 3. This act shall take effect July 1, 1999. SENATE SUMMARY Provides that all checks, except cashiers' checks, which are received by the campaign treasurer must be endorsed by the candidate prior to being deposited in a campaign depository. Prohibits a legislator from soliciting or accepting campaign contributions on behalf of a legislator, political party, or legislative candidate 30 days prior to a regular or special session of the Legislature, during a regular or special legislative session, or 14 days following a regular or special legislative session.

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
