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A bill to be entitled

An act relating to the operation of cardrooms; amending s. 849.086, F.S.; revising standards on when cardrooms may be operated and the amount of bets allowable for each round, hand, or game; authorizing facilities to award prizes; redefining the terms "authorized games" and "net proceeds"; abolishing certain admissions taxes; revising the amount of cardroom receipts that must be used to supplement greyhound and jai alai purses; providing an effective date.

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Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

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Section 1. Paragraphs (a) and (j) of subsection (2) and subsections (7), (8), and (13) of section 849.086, Florida Statutes, are amended to read:

849.086 Cardrooms authorized.--

- (2) DEFINITIONS. -- As used in this section:
- "Authorized games" means only those games that are described in the most current edition of Hoyle's Rules of Games authorized by s. 849.085(2)(a) and that which are played in a nonbanking manner.
- "Net proceeds" means the total amount of gross receipts received by a cardroom operator from cardroom operations less direct operating expenses related to cardroom operations, including labor costs, admission taxes only if a separate admission fee is charged for entry to the cardroom facility,gross receipts taxes imposed on cardroom operators 31 by this section, the annual cardroom license fees imposed by

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this section on each table operated at a cardroom, and reasonable promotional costs excluding officer and director compensation, interest on capital debt, legal fees, real estate taxes, bad debts, contributions or donations, or overhead and depreciation expenses not directly related to the operation of the cardrooms.

- (7) CONDITIONS FOR OPERATING A CARDROOM. --
- (a) A cardroom may only be operated at the location specified on the cardroom license issued by the division, and such location may only be the location at which the pari-mutuel permitholder is authorized to conduct pari-mutuel wagering activities pursuant to such permitholder's valid pari-mutuel permit and current license.
- (b) A cardroom may be operated at the facility only when the facility is authorized to accept wagers on pari-mutuel events during its authorized meet. A cardroom may begin operations within 2 hours prior to the post time of the first pari-mutuel event conducted live at the pari-mutuel facility on which wagers are accepted by the facility and must cease operations by 2 a.m. on the following day within 2 hours after the conclusion of the last pari-mutuel event conducted live at the pari-mutuel facility on which wagers are accepted.
- (c) A cardroom operator must at all times employ and provide a nonplaying dealer for each table on which authorized card games which traditionally utilize a dealer are conducted at the cardroom. Such dealers may not have any participatory interest in any game other than the dealing of cards and may not have an interest in the outcome of the game. providing of such dealers by a licensee shall not be construed as constituting the conducting of a banking game by the 31 cardroom operator.

 (d) A facility that operates a cardroom may award giveaways or prizes to players who hold combinations of cards specified by the cardroom operator.

(e)(d) Each cardroom operator shall conspicuously post upon the premises of the cardroom a notice which contains a copy of the cardroom license; a list of authorized games offered by the cardroom; the wagering limits imposed by the house, if any; any additional house rules regarding operation of the cardroom or the playing of any game; and all costs to players to participate, including any rake by the house. In addition, each cardroom operator shall post at each table a notice of the minimum and maximum bets authorized at such table and the fee for participation in the game conducted.

 $\underline{(f)}$ (e) The cardroom facility shall be subject to inspection by the division or any law enforcement agency during the licensee's regular business hours. The inspection will specifically encompass the permitholder internal control procedures approved by the division.

 $\underline{(g)(f)}$ A cardroom operator may refuse entry to or refuse to allow to play any person who is objectionable, undesirable, or disruptive, but such refusal shall not be on the basis of race, creed, color, religion, sex, national origin, marital status, physical handicap, or age, except as provided in this section.

- (8) METHOD OF WAGERS; LIMITATION. --
- (a) No wagering may be conducted using money or other negotiable currency. Games may only be played utilizing a wagering system whereby all players' money is first converted by the house to tokens or chips which shall be used for wagering only at that specific cardroom.

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- (b) <u>Each bet</u> The winnings of any player in a single round, hand, or game may not exceed\$2\$10 in value. The fee charged by the cardroom for participation in the game shall not be included in the calculation of the limitation on the bet pot size provided in this paragraph.
- (c) Notwithstanding the limit prescribed in paragraph (b), a facility may conduct a tournament at which there is no limit on the amount of winnings for a single round, hand, or game. Such a tournament may not be conducted by that facility more frequently than quarterly.
 - (13) TAXES AND OTHER PAYMENTS. --
- (a) Each cardroom operator shall pay a tax to the state of 10 percent of the cardroom operation's monthly gross receipts.
- (b) An admission tax equal to 15 percent of the admission charge for entrance to the licensee's cardroom facility, or 10 cents, whichever is greater, is imposed on each person entering the cardroom. This admission tax shall apply only if a separate admission fee is charged for entry to the cardroom facility. If a single admission fee is charged which authorizes entry to both or either the pari-mutuel facility and the cardroom facility, the admission tax shall be payable only once and shall be payable pursuant to chapter 550. The cardroom licensee shall be responsible for collecting the admission tax. An admission tax is imposed on any free passes or complimentary cards issued to guests by licensees in an amount equal to the tax imposed on the regular and usual admission charge for entrance to the licensee's cardroom facility. A cardroom licensee may issue tax-free passes to its officers, officials, and employees or other persons actually engaged in working at the cardroom, including

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30 31 accredited press representatives such as reporters and editors, and may also issue tax-free passes to other cardroom licensees for the use of their officers and officials. The licensee shall file with the division a list of all persons to whom tax-free passes are issued.

(b)(c) Payment of the admission tax and gross receipts tax imposed by this section shall be paid to the division. The division shall deposit these sums with the Treasurer, one-half being credited to the Pari-mutuel Wagering Trust Fund and one-half being credited to the General Revenue Fund. The cardroom licensee shall remit to the division payment for the admission tax, the gross receipts tax, and the licensee fees. Such payments shall be remitted to the division on the fifth day of each calendar month for taxes and fees imposed for the preceding month's cardroom activities. Licensees shall file a report under oath by the fifth day of each calendar month for all taxes remitted during the preceding calendar month. report shall, under oath, indicate the total of all admissions, the cardroom activities for the preceding calendar month, and such other information as is may be prescribed by the division.

(c)(d) Each greyhound and jai alai permitholder that which operates a cardroom facility shall utilize at least 10 4 percent of such permitholder's cardroom monthly gross receipts to supplement greyhound purses or jai alai prize money, respectively, during the permitholder's next ensuing pari-mutuel meet. Each thoroughbred and harness horse racing permitholder that which operates a cardroom facility shall utilize at least 50 percent of such permitholder's cardroom monthly net proceeds as follows: 47 percent to supplement

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purses and 3 percent to supplement breeders' awards during the permitholder's next ensuing racing meet.

(d) (d) (e) The failure of any licensee to make payments as prescribed in paragraph(b)(c)is a violation of this section, and the licensee may be subjected by the division to a civil penalty of up to \$1,000 for each day the tax payment is not remitted. All penalties imposed and collected shall be deposited in the General Revenue Fund. If a licensee fails to pay penalties imposed by order of the division under this subsection, the division may suspend or revoke the license of the cardroom operator or deny issuance of any further license to the cardroom operator.

(e) (f) The cardroom shall be deemed an accessory use to a licensed pari-mutuel operation and, except as provided in chapter 550, a municipality, county, or political subdivision may not assess or collect any additional license tax, sales tax, or excise tax on such cardroom operation.

(f) All of the moneys deposited in the Pari-mutuel Wagering Trust Fund, except as set forth in paragraph(g)(h), shall be utilized and distributed in the manner specified in s. 550.135(3) and (4). However, cardroom tax revenues shall be kept separate from pari-mutuel tax revenues and shall not be used for making the disbursement to counties provided in s. 550.135(1).

(g) (h) One-quarter of the moneys deposited into the Pari-mutuel Wagering Trust Fund pursuant to paragraph(f)(g) shall, by October 1 of each year, be distributed to counties in which the cardrooms are located; however, if two or more pari-mutuel racetracks are located within the same incorporated municipality, the cardroom funds shall be 31 distributed to the municipality. If a pari-mutuel facility is situated in such a manner that it is located in more than one county, the site of the cardroom facility shall determine the location for purposes of disbursement of tax revenues under this paragraph. The division shall, by September 1 of each year, determine: the amount of taxes deposited into the Pari-mutuel Wagering Trust Fund pursuant to this section from each cardroom licensee; the location by county of each cardroom; whether the cardroom is located in the unincorporated area of the county or within an incorporated municipality; and, the total amount to be distributed to each eligible county and municipality.

Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 1999.

SENATE SUMMARY

Authorizes pari-mutuel facilities to operate cardrooms at any time during which wagers are accepted by those facilities, regardless of whether they are conducting live pari-mutuel events. Decreases the maximum amount a player may bet in any one round, hand, or game from \$10 to \$2, except that a facility may conduct quarterly tournaments at which there is no limit. Authorizes facilities to award prizes to players. Abolishes the tax on admission to cardrooms. Increases, to 10 percent of the monthly gross receipts, the amount of cardroom proceeds which a permitholder must use to supplement greyhound or jai alai purses. Redefines the games that are eligible for play in a cardroom.
