17	Section 3. <u>The Legislature recognizes a need for</u>		
18	<u>providing a capability within the state for responding to the</u>		
19	<u>reuse, recycling, and proper management of waste products</u>		
20	<u>generated by users of lead-containing products within the</u>		
21	<u>state.</u>		
22	Section 4. <u>The Department of Environmental Protection</u>		
23	<u>is authorized to use funds from the Solid Waste Management</u>		
24	<u>Trust Fund as grants to Florida-based businesses that recycle</u>		
25	<u>lead-acid batteries and other lead-containing materials,</u>		
26	<u>including products such as televisions and computer monitors</u>		
27	<u>that utilize lead-containing cathode ray tubes. This incentive</u>		
28	<u>funding may be used for research and development in methods to</u>		
29	<u>recover and recycle lead from the environment; for innovative</u>		
30	<u>technologies and equipment to process and recycle</u>		
31	<u>lead-containing materials; and for establishing an</u>		

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1 infrastructure to collect and transport lead-containing
2 material to Florida-based recycling businesses.

3 Section 5. The Department of Environmental Protection
4 is directed to work with the Department of Management Services
5 to implement a pilot program to collect lead-containing
6 products, including end-of-life computers and other electronic
7 equipment from state and local agencies. Local governments are
8 encouraged to establish collection and recycling programs for
9 publicly and privately owned lead-containing products,
10 including end-of-life televisions, computers, and other
11 electronic products through existing recycling and household
12 hazardous-waste-management programs.

13 Section 6. The sum of \$400,000 is appropriated from
14 the Solid Waste Management Trust Fund to the Department of
15 Environmental Protection for Fiscal Year 1999-2000 to fund the
16 grants authorized by this act. The department is authorized to
17 request annual funding for these grants through the Fiscal
18 Year 2004-2005.

19 Section 7. This act, except for sections 1 and 2,
20 which shall take effect October 1, 1999, shall take effect
21 July 1, 1999.
