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| 13 | Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:      |
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| 15 | Section 1. It is the intent of the Legislature to              |
| 16 | restore the public faith in the use of lottery funds as        |
| 17 | enhancements to public education. To that end, the Legislature |
| 18 | has dedicated funds from the Educational Enhancement Trust     |
| 19 | Fund to specific educational programs. The Teacher Learning    |
| 20 | Enhancement and Assistance Program will further this goal by   |
| 21 | dedicating a portion of the lottery dollars directly to the    |
| 22 | classrooms to be used by the teachers to purchase learning     |
| 23 | enhancements for their students. It is further the intent of   |
| 24 | the Legislature to replace lottery funds that will be used for |
| 25 | this program with a proportionate increase in general revenue  |
| 26 | to the Florida Education Finance Program.                      |
