I. SUMMARY:

This legislation re-creates the University of Florida Agricultural Extension Service Incidental Trust Fund without modification, effective November 4, 2000. The University of Florida Agricultural Extension Service Incidental Trust Fund, FLAIR #492219, is administered by the State University System. This fund was last re-created effective November 4, 1996, by Chpater 95-13, L.O.F.

II. SUBSTANTIVE ANALYSIS:

A. PRESENT SITUATION:

None.

BRIEF DESCRIPTION OF THE FUND'S USES OR PURPOSES:

The fund is used as a depository for proceeds received from research and training activities provided by Cooperative Extension Centers throughout the state.

MAJOR SOURCES OF REVENUE FOR THE FUND:

The major sources of revenue for the fund are the sale of goods and instructional training services. According to Comptroller data, receipts to this fund for FY 1997-98 were \$862,663.

B. EFFECT OF PROPOSED CHANGES:

This bill re-creates the trust fund without modification.

C. STATUTE(S) AFFECTED:

None.

III. FISCAL ANALYSIS & ECONOMIC IMPACT STATEMENT:

This legislation has no fiscal impact on state agencies or state funds, on local governments as a whole or on the private sector. It simply re-creates, without modification, an existing state trust fund and continues the current use of the fund.
