I. SUMMARY:

This legislation re-creates the University of Florida Agricultural Experiment Station Incidental Trust Fund without modification, effective November 4, 2000. The University of Florida Agricultural Experiment Station Incidental Trust Fund, FLAIR #492210, is administered by the State University System. This fund was last re-created effective November 4, 1996, by Chapter 95-12, L.O.F.

II. SUBSTANTIVE ANALYSIS:

A. PRESENT SITUATION:

1. MAJOR STATUTES THAT CONTROL THE TRUST FUND:

None.

2. BRIEF DESCRIPTION OF THE FUND'S USES OR PURPOSES:

The fund is used as a segregation of funds generated by activities conducted at the various Research and Education Centers throughout the state.

3. MAJOR SOURCES OF REVENUE FOR THE FUND:

The major sources of revenue for the fund are the sale of goods, including livestock, agronomic products, meat, dairy, poultry, and revenues for site cleanup activities. According to Comptroller data, receipts to this fund for FY 1997-98 were \$2.2 million.

B. EFFECT OF PROPOSED CHANGES:

This bill re-creates the trust fund without modification.

C. STATUTE(S) AFFECTED:

None.

III. FISCAL ANALYSIS & ECONOMIC IMPACT STATEMENT:

This legislation has no fiscal impact on state agencies or state funds, on local governments as a whole or on the private sector. It simply re-creates, without modification, an existing state trust fund and continues the current use of the fund.
