Subsection (1) of section 110.1099, Florida 13 Statutes, 1998 Supplement, is amended to read: 14 110.1099 Education and training opportunities for 15 16 state employees .--17 (1) Education and training are an integral component in improving the delivery of services to the public. 18 19 Recognizing that the application of productivity-enhancing 20 technology and practice demand continuous educational and 21 training opportunities, state employees may be authorized to 22 receive fundable tuition waivers on a space-available basis or vouchers to attend work-related courses at public 23 universities. Student credit hours generated by state employee 24 25 fee waivers shall be fundable credit hours. A state employee who attempts to register for a work-related tuition waiver 26 27 course must be allowed to take the course even when the course 28 is classified as closed if the professor authorizes an 29 override for the employee to participate in the course. 30 31
