Subsection (1) of section 229.58, Florida 20 Statutes, 1998 Supplement, is amended to read: 21 229.58 District and school advisory councils.--22 (1) ESTABLISHMENT.--The school board shall establish an advisory 23 council for each school in the district, and shall develop 24 25 procedures for the election and appointment of advisory 26 council members. Each school advisory council shall include in 27 its name the words "school advisory council." The school 28 advisory council shall be the sole body responsible for final 29 decisionmaking at the school relating to implementation of the

provisions of ss. 229.591, 229.592, and 230.23(16). A majority

31 of the members of each school advisory council must be persons

who are not employed by the school. Each advisory council shall be composed of the following:

- 1. The school principal.and an appropriately balanced number of
- 2. Teachers, education support employees, students, parents, and other business and community citizens who are representative of the ethnic, racial, and economic community served by the school, giving consideration to the school's ethnic, racial, and economic makeup.

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School boards shall develop procedures to ensure balanced school advisory council membership. Vocational-technical center and high school advisory councils shall include students, and middle and junior high school advisory councils may include students. School advisory councils of vocational-technical and adult education centers are not required to include parents as members.

- (b) Council members representing teachers, education support employees, students, and parents shall be elected by their respective peer groups at the school in a fair and equitable manner as follows:
 - Teachers shall be elected by teachers.
- Education support employees shall be elected by 2. education support employees.
 - 3. Students shall be elected by students.
 - 4. Parents shall be elected by parents.

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The school board shall establish procedures for use by schools in selecting business and community members. Such procedures shall include means of ensuring wide notice of vacancies and 31 for taking input on possible members from local business,

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chambers of commerce, community and civic organizations and 2 groups, and the public at large. The school board shall review 3 the membership composition of each advisory council. 4 the school board determine that the membership elected by the 5 school is not representative of the ethnic, racial, and 6 economic community served by the school, the board shall 7 appoint additional members to achieve proper representation. 8 The Florida Commission on Education Reform and Accountability shall serve as a review body to determine if schools have 9 10 maximized their efforts to include on their advisory councils 11 minority persons and persons of lower socioeconomic status. Although schools should be strongly encouraged to establish 12 school advisory councils, any school district that has a 13 student population of 10,000 or fewer may establish a district 14 advisory council which shall include at least one duly elected 15 teacher from each school in the district. For the purposes of 16 17 school advisory councils and district advisory councils, the term "teacher" shall include classroom teachers, certified 18 19 student services personnel, and media specialists. For 20 purposes of this paragraph, "education support employee" means any person employed by a school who is not defined as 21 instructional or administrative personnel pursuant to s. 22 228.041 and whose duties require 20 or more hours in each 23 24 normal working week. 25

(c)(b) The school board may establish a district advisory council representative of the district and composed of teachers, students, parents, and other citizens or a district advisory council which may be comprised of representatives of each school advisory council. Recognized schoolwide support groups which meet all criteria established by law or rule may function as school advisory councils.

 Section 2. Paragraph (f) of subsection (2) of section 229.594, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:

229.594 Powers and duties of the commission.--

- (2) The commission shall:
- (f) Prepare and submit to the Governor, the President of the Senate, the Speaker of the House of Representatives, the Commissioner of Education, and each Cabinet member a report and recommendations by December October 1 of each year. The annual reports of the commission shall be made available to other appropriate governmental officials and to the public schools in this state.

Section 3. Paragraphs (b) and (c) of subsection (16) of section 230.23, Florida Statutes, 1998 Supplement, are amended to read:

- 230.23 Powers and duties of school board.--The school board, acting as a board, shall exercise all powers and perform all duties listed below:
- ACCOUNTABILITY. -- Maintain a system of school improvement and education accountability as provided by statute and State Board of Education rule. This system of school improvement and education accountability shall be consistent with, and implemented through, the district's continuing system of planning and budgeting required by this section and ss. 229.555 and 237.041. This system of school improvement and education accountability shall include, but not be limited to, the following:
- (b) Approval process.--Develop a process for approval of a school improvement plan presented by an individual school and its advisory council which shall include a review by the school advisory council of any revisions made to the plan

prior to its submission to the school board for approval. The school advisory council may, by majority vote, concur or reject these revisions. The plan shall be amended accordingly prior to submission to the school board for approval. In the event a board does not approve a school improvement plan after exhausting this process, the Florida Commission on Education Reform and Accountability shall be notified of the need for assistance.

plan of increasing individualized assistance and intervention for each school that does not meet or make adequate progress, based upon the recommendations of the commission, as defined pursuant to statute and State Board of Education rule, toward meeting the goals and standards of its approved school improvement plan. The school board must hold at least one public hearing to present the provisions included in the 3-year plan, and must hold an annual public hearing to report on the progress of schools receiving assistance and intervention.

Section 4. This act shall take effect July 1, 1999.

HOUSE SUMMARY

Revises requirements for the composition of school advisory councils. Requires school boards to develop procedures to ensure balanced school advisory council membership.
