The distribution of any revenues received shall be determined by formal agreement between the department board 15 16 of directors and the developing system or institution. 17 (c) The department board of directors shall identify 18 state educational priorities and issue a request for proposals by June 1 in every year in which funds are available for 19 grants. The department board shall ensure the quality of the 20 21 programs and courses produced through the grants and produce an annual status report by March 1 describing the projects 22 23 funded and accounting for any proceeds. 24 Section 6.
