Subsection (8) is added to section 240.311, Florida Statutes, 1998 Supplement, to read: 18 19 240.311 State Board of Community Colleges; powers and 20 duties.--21 (8)(a) The State Board of Community Colleges is 22 authorized to develop and produce work products which relate 23 to mechanisms to provide for consolidated and coordinated program development and educational endeavors to support 24 25 distance learning instruction which are subject to trademark, 26 copyright, or patent statutes. To this end, the board shall 27 consider the relative contribution by the personnel employed in the development of such work products and shall enter into 28 29 binding agreements with such personnel, organizations, 30 corporations, or government entities, which agreements shall 31 establish the percentage of ownership of such trademarks,

copyrights, or patents. Any other law to the contrary
notwithstanding, the board is authorized in its own name to:

- 1. Perform all things necessary to secure letters of patent, copyrights, and trademarks on any such work products and to enforce its rights therein.
- 2. License, lease, assign, or otherwise give written consent to any person, firm, or corporation for the manufacture or use thereof on a royalty basis or for such other consideration as the board deems proper.
- 3. Take any action necessary, including legal action, to protect the same against improper or unlawful use or infringement.
- 4. Enforce the collection of any sums due the board for the manufacture or use thereof by any other party.
- 5. Sell any such work products and execute all instruments necessary to consummate any such sale.
- 6. Perform all other acts necessary and proper for the execution of powers and duties provided by this paragraph.

Any proceeds therefrom shall be deposited and expended by a Florida not-for-profit corporation, incorporated under the provisions of chapter 617 and approved by the Department of State, to be used as directed by the board to pay the cost of producing and disseminating educational materials and products to carry out the intent of this act. Any action taken by the board in securing or exploiting such trademarks, copyrights, or patents shall, within 30 days, be reported by the board to the Department of State.

(b) The board is authorized to publish, produce, or have produced materials and products and shall make them readily available for appropriate use in the state system of

education. The board is authorized to charge an amount 2 adequate to cover the essential cost of producing and 3 disseminating such materials and products in the state system 4 of education and is authorized to sell copies for educational 5 use to nonpublic schools in the state and to the public. 6 (c) Any Florida not-for-profit corporation receiving 7 funds pursuant to this section shall make provisions for an 8 annual postaudit of its financial accounts to be conducted by 9 an independent certified public accountant in accordance with rules to be adopted by the board. The annual audit report 10 shall be submitted to the Auditor General and the board for 11 12 review. The board and the Auditor General shall have the 13 authority to require and receive from the organization or from 14 its independent auditor any detail or supplemental data 15 relative to the operation of the organization. Section 2. By December 31, 1999, and annually 16 17 thereafter, the State Board of Community Colleges shall report on the implementation of this act to the Speaker of the House 18 19 of Representatives and the President of the Senate. 20 Section 3.
