The outstanding unpaid amount of the order of restitution bears interest in accordance with s. 55.03, and, 17 when properly recorded, becomes a lien on real estate owned by 18 19 the defendant. If civil enforcement is necessary, the defendant shall be liable for costs and attorney's fees 20 21 incurred by the victim in enforcing the order. Notwithstanding 22 this section, a court which has ordered restitution for a misdemeanor offense shall retain jurisdiction for the purpose 23 of enforcing the restitution order for any period, not to 24 exceed 5 years, that is pronounced by the court at the time 25 26 restitution is ordered. 27 Section 2.
