I. FINAL ACTION STATUS:

HB 1315 passed the House on March 9, 1999, and passed the Senate on March 16, 1999. The bill was approved by the Governor and became law April 6, 1999 (Chapter 99-91, Laws of Florida).

II. SUMMARY:

This legislation re-creates the Hotel and Restaurant Trust Fund without modification, effective November 4, 2000. The Hotel and Restaurant Trust Fund, FLAIR #79-2-375, is administered by the Department of Business and Professional Regulation. This fund was last re-created effective November 4, 1996, by Chapter 96-4, Laws of Florida.

III. SUBSTANTIVE ANALYSIS:

A. PRESENT SITUATION:

1. MAJOR STATUTES THAT CONTROL THE TRUST FUND:

Section 509.072, F.S., creates the trust fund.
Sections 399.045, 399.05, 399.07, 399.105, and 509.261, F.S., provide revenue sources for the fund.
Section 509.036, F.S., provides uses for the fund.

2. BRIEF DESCRIPTION OF THE FUND'S USES OR PURPOSES:

The trust fund is used for the administration and operation of the Division of Hotels and Restaurants and the carrying out of all laws and rules under the jurisdiction of the division pertaining to the construction, maintenance, and operation of public lodging establishments and public food service establishments.

3. MAJOR SOURCES OF REVENUE FOR THE FUND:

The major sources of revenue for the fund are licenses and fees. According to Comptroller data, receipts to this fund for FY 1997-98 were \$28.4 million.

B. EFFECT OF PROPOSED CHANGES:

This bill re-creates the trust fund without modification.

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C. STATUTE(S) AFFECTED:

None.

IV. FISCAL ANALYSIS & ECONOMIC IMPACT STATEMENT:

This legislation has no fiscal impact on state agencies or state funds, on local governments as a whole or on the private sector. It simply re-creates, without modification, an existing state trust fund and continues the current use of the fund.
