A bill to be entitled 1 2 An act relating to public records; providing an exemption from public records requirements for 3 4 certain records of domestic violence used in 5 unemployment compensation cases; providing an expiration date; providing a finding of public 6 7 necessity; providing a contingent effective 8 date. 9 10 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida: 11 Section 1. All records and evidence of domestic 12 violence experienced by an employee who has applied for 13 unemployment compensation with the Division of Unemployment 14 Compensation in accordance with section 443.101, Florida 15 Statutes, are exempt from the disclosure provisions of section 16 24(a) of Article I of the State Constitution and section 17 119.07(1), Florida Statutes, except to the extent consented to 18 19 by the employee when disclosure is necessary to protect the 20 employee's safety. This exemption is subject to the Open Government Sunset Review Act in accordance with section 21 22 119.15, Florida Statutes, and expires on October 2, 2004, 23 unless reviewed and reenacted by the Legislature. Section 2. The Legislature finds that it is a public 24 25 necessity that the records of domestic violence experienced by an employee who has applied for unemployment compensation be 26 27 held confidential in order to protect the employee. 28 Furthermore, the Legislature finds that it would be an invasion of privacy for these sensitive domestic violence 29 30 records to be revealed to the public. 31

Section 3. This act shall take effect on the effective date of SB ___ or similar legislation, relating to unemployment compensation, and shall not take effect if that legislation does not become a law. SENATE SUMMARY Provides an exemption from public records disclosure requirements for records of domestic violence experienced by an employee who has applied for unemployment compensation benefits. Provides a finding of public necessity and an expiration date.
